## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

[Aligns term of Adjutant General with term of appointing Governor.] Deletes provision establishing eligibility requirements for Adjutant General. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## 2 Relating to the Adjutant General; amending ORS 396.150; and declaring an emergency. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3 SECTION 1. ORS 396.150 is amended to read: 4 396.150. (1) The Governor shall appoint an Adjutant General who shall hold office for a four-year 5 6 term or until: (a) The Adjutant General resigns; 7 (b) The Adjutant General is relieved by reason of [resignation,] withdrawal of federal recog-8 9 nition; or 10 (c) The Adjutant General is relieved by the Governor or for cause to be determined by a court-martial. 11 12(2) The current term of an Adjutant General continues until its prescribed expiration date while 13 [such] the Adjutant General is serving in a federal active duty status under an order or call by the President of the United States. Voluntary entry onto extended active duty by a person holding the 14 office of Adjutant General is an automatic resignation of [such] the officer. 15 [(2) A person is eligible for appointment to the office of Adjutant General if the person is an officer 16 of the Oregon National Guard, federally recognized in the grade of lieutenant colonel or higher, and 17 has completed at least six years' service in the Oregon National Guard as a federally recognized offi-18 19 cer.] (3) The Adjutant General may be appointed in the grade of lieutenant colonel or higher, but not 2021exceeding that of lieutenant general. If appointed in a lower grade, the Adjutant General may be promoted by the Governor to any grade not exceeding that of lieutenant general. 22SECTION 2. This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 23peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect 24 on its passage. 2526
