4 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of 5 \$6,908,809 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limit for 6 payment of expenses from federal funds collected or received by the Department of Cor-7 rections.

8 <u>SECTION 4.</u> For the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, expenditures by the Department 9 of Corrections from federal funds for debt service on Build America Bonds are not limited.

10 <u>SECTION 5.</u> This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect
July 1, 2011.

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
