SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Public Defense Services Commission for certain biennial expenses.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by commission.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2011.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to the financial administration of the Public Defense Services Commission; appropriating
money; limiting expenditures; and declaring an emergency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> There are appropriated to the Public Defense Services Commission, for the

biennium beginning July 1, 2011, out of the General Fund, the following amounts for the fol lowing purposes:

8 (1) Appellate Division \$ 15,888,474

9 (2) Public Defense Services

10 Account...... \$190,775,825

11 (3) Contract and Business

12 Services Division...... \$ 3,129,862

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$468,312
is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limit for payment of
expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Public Defense Services
Commission.

18 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 19 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect 20 July 1, 2011.
