SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Prohibits health benefit plan from conditioning coverage of treatment for diabetes or diabetes comorbidity that is prescribed by health care provider on failure of another therapy or treatment.

A BILL FOR AN ACT 1 Relating to health insurance. 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4 SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2011 Act is added to and made a part of the Insurance Code. 5 SECTION 2. A health benefit plan, as defined in ORS 743.730, shall not require an insured 6 to first try and fail an alternative therapy or over-the-counter treatment for diabetes or a 7 comorbidity of diabetes before providing or reimbursing a therapy or treatment prescribed 8 by a health care provider and approved for that use by the United States Food and Drug 9 Administration. SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2011 Act applies to health benefit plans in effect on or after 10 11 the effective date of this 2011 Act. 12
