## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[*Makes permanent*] **Extends sunset for** temporary provisions relating to post-prison supervision for offenders sentenced to one year or less of incarceration. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

(B) After reviewing the report, the supervisory authority may extend the active post-prison
supervision period in accordance with section 23 (4), chapter 660, Oregon Laws 2009.

9 (d) Section 23, chapter 660, Oregon Laws 2009, and the provisions of this subsection and sub-10 section (13) of this section do not apply to a person sentenced to the legal and physical custody of 11 a supervisory authority under ORS 137.124 (2) whose term of active post-prison supervision imposed 12 by the sentencing court expires on or before the date that is two months after July 1, 2009.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect
 on its passage.
