

Senate Bill 917

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON RULES

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates crime of unlawfully transferring large capacity magazine. Punishes by maximum of one year's imprisonment, \$6,250 fine, or both.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to large capacity magazines.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) A person commits the crime of unlawfully transferring a large capacity**
5 **magazine if the person knowingly sells, or otherwise transfers for consideration, a large ca-**
6 **capacity magazine.**

7 **(2) This section does not apply to the sale or transfer for consideration of a large ca-**
8 **capacity magazine to:**

9 **(a) A law enforcement unit of the federal government or a law enforcement unit as de-**
10 **finied in ORS 181.610; or**

11 **(b) The active or reserve military forces of this state or of the United States.**

12 **(3) Unlawfully transferring a large capacity magazine is a Class A misdemeanor.**

13 **(4) As used in this section, "large capacity magazine" means any ammunition feeding**
14 **device with the capacity to accept more than 10 rounds of ammunition, but does not include:**

15 **(a) A feeding device that has been permanently altered so that it cannot accommodate**
16 **more than 10 rounds of ammunition.**

17 **(b) A tubular magazine that is contained in a lever action firearm.**

18 **(c) A 0.22 caliber tube ammunition feeding device.**
