Senate Bill 917

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates crime of unlawfully transferring large capacity magazine. Punishes by maximum of one year's imprisonment, \$6,250 fine, or both.

2	Relating to large capacity magazines.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) A person commits the crime of unlawfully transferring a large capacity
5	magazine if the person knowingly sells, or otherwise transfers for consideration, a large ca-
6	pacity magazine.
7	(2) This section does not apply to the sale or transfer for consideration of a large ca-
8	pacity magazine to:
9	(a) A law enforcement unit of the federal government or a law enforcement unit as de-
10	fined in ORS 181.610; or
11	(b) The active or reserve military forces of this state or of the United States.
12	(3) Unlawfully transferring a large capacity magazine is a Class A misdemeanor.
13	(4) As used in this section, "large capacity magazine" means any ammunition feeding
14	device with the capacity to accept more than 10 rounds of ammunition, but does not include:
15	(a) A feeding device that has been permanently altered so that it cannot accommodate
16	more than 10 rounds of ammunition.
17	(b) A tubular magazine that is contained in a lever action firearm.
18	(c) A 0.22 caliber tube ammunition feeding device.
