Senate Bill 97

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs certain health professional regulatory boards to adopt rules by January 1, 2014, requiring licensees to document participation in continuing education opportunities relating to cultural competency approved by Oregon Health Authority.

Requires authority to collaborate with boards to define "cultural competency," develop list of approved continuing education opportunities and provide list to boards on or before January 1, 2013. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

- **3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**
- 4 **SECTION 1.** (1) As used in this section, "board" means the:
- 5 (a) State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology;
- 6 (b) State Board of Chiropractic Examiners;
- 7 (c) State Board of Licensed Social Workers;
- 8 (d) Oregon Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists;
- 9 (e) Oregon Board of Dentistry;

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- 10 (f) Board of Examiners of Licensed Dietitians;
- 11 (g) State Board of Massage Therapists;
- 12 (h) Oregon Board of Naturopathic Medicine;
- 13 (i) Oregon State Board of Nursing;
- 14 (j) Nursing Home Administrators Board;
- 15 (k) Oregon Board of Optometry;
- 16 (L) State Board of Pharmacy;
- 17 (m) Oregon Medical Board;
- 18 (n) Occupational Therapy Licensing Board;
- 19 (o) Physical Therapist Licensing Board;
- 20 (p) State Board of Psychologist Examiners;
- 21 (q) Board of Medical Imaging; and
- (r) Oregon Health Authority, to the extent that the authority certifies emergency med ical technicians.
- (2) In collaboration with the Oregon Health Authority, a board shall adopt rules making
 it a condition of licensure that a person licensed by the board document participation in
- 26 continuing education designed to reduce health care disparities and improve cultural com-
- 27 petency, as defined by the authority under section 2 of this 2011 Act.
- 28 SECTION 2. (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall collaborate with the boards listed in

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section 1 of this 2011 Act to: 1 2 (a) Define "cultural competency"; and (b) Determine how often persons licensed by the boards must complete the continuing 3 education required under section 1 of this 2011 Act. 4 (2) The authority shall develop a list of continuing education opportunities relating to 5 cultural competency approved by the authority and make the list available to each of the 6 boards listed in section 1 of this 2011 Act. 7 (3) The continuing education opportunities may include, but need not be limited to: 8 9 (a) Courses delivered either in person or electronically; (b) Experiential learning such as cultural or linguistic immersion; 10 11 (c) Service learning; or 12(d) Specially designed cultural experiences. (4) The continuing education opportunities must teach attitudes, knowledge and skills 13 that enable a health care professional to care effectively for patients from diverse cultures, 14 15 groups and communities, including but not limited to: (a) Applying linguistic skills to communicate effectively with patients from diverse cul-16 17 tures, groups and communities; 18 (b) Using cultural information to establish therapeutic relationships; and (c) Eliciting, understanding and applying cultural and ethnic data in the process of clin-19 ical care. 20(5) The authority may accept gifts, grants or contributions from any public or private 2122source for the purpose of carrying out this section. Moneys received by the authority under 23this subsection shall be deposited into the Oregon Health Authority Fund established by ORS 413.031. 94 (6) The authority may contract with or award grant funding to a public or private entity 25to develop the list of or offer approved continuing education opportunities relating to cultural 2627competency. The authority is not subject to the requirements of ORS chapters 279A, 279B and 279C with respect to contracts entered into under this subsection. 28SECTION 3. (1) Section 2 of this 2011 Act becomes operative on January 1, 2013. 2930 (2) The Oregon Health Authority may take any action necessary before the operative date 31 specified in subsection (1) of this section to enable the authority to exercise, on and after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, all the duties, functions and powers 32conferred on the authority by section 2 of this 2011 Act. 33 34 SECTION 4. (1) Section 1 of this 2011 Act becomes operative on January 1, 2014. 35(2) A health professional regulatory board may take any action necessary before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section to enable the board to exercise, on and 36 37 after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, all the duties, functions and powers conferred on the board by section 1 of this 2011 Act. 38 (3) If a health professional regulatory board adopts rules requiring persons licensed by 39 the board to document participation in continuing education relating to cultural competency 40 before January 1, 2014, the board shall collaborate with the Oregon Health Authority in de-41 veloping the requirements. 42 SECTION 5. This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 43 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect 44 on its passage. 45

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
