## Senate Bill 988

Sponsored by Senator TELFER; Senators ATKINSON, BOQUIST, FERRIOLI, GEORGE, GIROD, KRUSE, MORSE, NELSON, OLSEN, STARR, THOMSEN, WHITSETT, WINTERS

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates Task Force on Oregon Business Regulations. Sunsets task force on June 30, 2012. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to regulation of businesses; and declaring an emergency.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Task Force on Oregon Business Regulations is established, consisting

5 of 11 members appointed as follows:

6 (a) The Governor shall appoint four members from among persons recommended, one 7 each by the leadership of the Democratic and Republican parties in each house of the Leg-

8 islative Assembly. If a person recommended by the leadership of the Democratic or Repub-

9 lican party is not approved by the Governor, the leadership shall recommend another person.

10 At least one of the members appointed under this paragraph must be a member of the Leg-

11 islative Assembly and at least one member must be a representative of the business sector

12 in this state.

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(b) The Governor shall appoint one additional member, without leadership recommen dation, from the Oregon Business Plan Steering Committee who shall serve as chairperson
 of the task force.

- (c) The chairperson of the task force shall appoint six members, one from each of the
   following regions of this state:
- 18 (A) Portland metropolitan area.
- 19 (B) Eastern Oregon.
- 20 (C) Coastal Oregon.
- 21 (D) Mid-Willamette Valley.
- 22 (E) Southern Oregon.
- 23 (F) Central Oregon.

(2)(a) The task force shall conduct a study on and research ways to improve the business
climate in this state. The task force shall focus on simplifying and streamlining the regulatory and permitting processes for business activities as set forth in the Oregon Business
Plan.

(b) The study conducted under paragraph (a) of this subsection must include but is not
 limited to research and recommendations for submitting future legislation regarding the
 following:

SB 988 (A) Regulatory streamlining; 1 2 (B) An assessment of the impacts on jobs of legislation and administrative rules regarding regulatory streamlining; 3 (C) Reforming the regulatory appeals processes to prevent lengthy or frivolous appeals; 4 (D) Time requirements for issuance of permits, pending enforcement actions and the 5 development of new regulations; 6 (E) Establishing one-stop, efficient permitting processes; 7 (F) The benefits and costs of evaluating compliance with administrative rules and regu-8 9 lations; 10 (G) Standards for administrative rulemaking; (H) Coordinating efforts to streamline regulatory processes with local, state and federal 11 12agencies; and (I) Initiatives proposed to streamline regulations at the local level. 13 (3) The task force may hold its meetings by telephone or by using any other electronic 14 15 communication device. (4) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the 16 transaction of business. 17 18 (5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the voting members of the task force. 19 (6) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint-20ment to become immediately effective. 2122(7) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the task force. 23(8) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force. 24 (9) The task force shall submit a report, and may include recommendations for legis-25lation, to the legislative committees or interim committees of the Legislative Assembly re-2627lated to business no later than February 1, 2012. (10) The Legislative Administration Committee shall provide administrative staff support 28 to the task force. 2930 (11) Members of the task force serve as volunteers and are not entitled to compensation, 31 including but not limited to travel and other expenses. (12) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist 32the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating 33 34 to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force 35consider necessary to perform their duties. SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2011 Act is repealed on June 30, 2012. 36 37 SECTION 3. This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect 38 on its passage. 39 40

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
