Senate Joint Memorial 9

Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with presession filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President (at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Veterans' Affairs)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Urges Congress to require Armed Forces of United States to examine cultural barriers in military and report to Congress with proposed solutions.

1	JOINT MEMORIAL
2	To the President of the United States and the Senate and the House of Representatives of the United
3	States of America, in Congress assembled:
4	We, your memorialists, the Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, in legis-
5	lative session assembled, respectfully represent as follows:
6	Whereas a significant percentage of servicemembers experience post-traumatic stress disorder,
7	traumatic brain injury and other service-connected medical issues because of their deployments to
8	Iraq and Afghanistan; and
9	Whereas suicide among servicemembers and veterans is at an unprecedented level; and
10	Whereas military sexual trauma, which can result in post-traumatic stress disorder, depression,
11	anxiety and other mental and emotional health concerns, is at an epidemic level in the Armed
12	Forces of the United States; and
13	Whereas military culture discourages servicemembers and veterans from identifying their med-
14	ical, emotional and psychological conditions; now, therefore,
15	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
16	(1) The Congress of the United States of America is respectfully urged to require the Armed
17	Forces of the United States to:
18	(a) Examine cultural barriers in the military that discourage servicemembers from identifying
19	their medical, emotional, psychological and other reintegration concerns; and
20	(b) Report the results of this examination to Congress, with proposed solutions that will en-
21	courage servicemembers to identify their medical, emotional, psychological and other reintegration

NOTE: Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

(2) A copy of this memorial shall be sent to the President of the United States, to the Senate

Majority Leader, to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and to each member of the Oregon
