## **Senate Joint Resolution 19**

Sponsored by Senator GEORGE (Presession filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to impose limitations on awards of noneconomic damages in civil actions. Refers proposed amendment to people for their approval or rejection at next regular general election.

## JOINT RESOLUTION 1 2 Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon: 3 **PARAGRAPH 1.** The Constitution of the State of Oregon is amended by creating a new section 12 to be added to and made a part of Article XV, such section to read: 4 $\mathbf{5}$ SECTION 12. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, noneconomic dam-6 ages may not be recovered in a civil action by or on behalf of an injured person in an amount 7 that exceeds: 8 (a) \$250,000, if the person is not permanently disabled by reason of the injury; or 9 (b) \$500,000, if the person is permanently disabled by reason of the injury. 10 (2) If a plaintiff establishes in a civil action that a defendant intentionally caused injury 11 to the plaintiff or that the injury was caused by gross negligence of a defendant, the plaintiff 12may recover noneconomic damages from the defendant in an amount not to exceed: 13 (a) \$500,000, if the plaintiff is not permanently disabled by reason of the injury; or 14 (b) \$750,000, if the plaintiff is permanently disabled by reason of the injury. 15 (3) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section, noneconomic damages may not 16 be recovered in a wrongful death action in an amount that exceeds \$500,000. 17 (4) If the plaintiff in a wrongful death action establishes that a defendant intentionally 18 caused the death of the decedent or that the death was caused by gross negligence of a defendant, the plaintiff may recover noneconomic damages from the defendant in an amount 19 20 not to exceed \$1 million. 21(5) The Legislative Assembly by law may establish criteria for determining when a phys-22ical or mental impairment is permanent for the purposes of this section. 23(6) For the purposes of this section: 24 (a) "Disabled" means having a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits 25one or more major life activities. 26 (b) "Noneconomic damages" means subjective, nonmonetary losses, including but not 27limited to pain, mental suffering, emotional distress, humiliation, injury to reputation, loss 28of consortium, inconvenience, interference with normal and usual activities apart from 29 gainful employment, and loss of care, comfort, companionship and society. 30
