WHAT IS PREVENTNET?



PreventNet is a coalition of social service agencies that are working together to create, enhance, and sustain a seamless system of care, advocacy and supports for the well-being of children, youth, and families in Clackamas County. PreventNet Community Schools represent a partnership between local schools and community service providers to improve academic success and reduce juvenile delinquency. Northwest Family Services administers PreventNet sites at Alder Creek, Gardiner, and Kraxberger Middle Schools and Rex Putnam High School. PreventNet is funded by a grant through the Clackamas County Commission on Children Youth and Families.

UNIVERSAL YOUTH



Case Coordination

Weekly meetings with students throughout the school year to develop a "Person Centered Plan," providing support and advice for academic and social success.

After School Programs

After school activities such as dance, crafts, sports, cultural activities, robotics, gardening, academic help, and more.



Parenting

Education

Classes for parents offered throughout the year on topics such as family connection, family finances management, and drug, alcohol and gang prevention.

Family Events

Family-friendly events promoting family unity and connection with the school.

Focus Areas and Funded Programming

Family Support

- Healthy Start/Healthy Families Home visits and one-on-one parenting support (220 families served, 876 screened and provided resources 2010)
- Family Stepping Stones Relief Nursery (42 families served since opening September 2010)

School Success

- PreventNet School-based Services K-12

Juvenile Crime Prevention

Clackamas County CCF Gets Results

- 96% of Healthy Start/Healthy Families served by reports increased positive parent/child interactions and 92% report reading to their child at least 3 times per week (Clackamas County's rates of child abuse/neglect or threat of harm is one of the lowest in the state at 6.7 per 1000 children).
- Grant writing and technical assistance resulted in the formation of the Estacada Community Coalition and its successful application for \$125,000 in federal funds per year for the next 10 years to combat underage drinking and drug use.
- Provided leadership in convening key child abuse stakeholders and secured over \$700,000 dollars to build Clackamas County's first Relief Nursery which will reduce entry into foster care, keeping or reconnecting 88 percent of at-risk families served with their children.
- Increased capacity to serve DV victims through the development and implementation of a Domestic Violence Prevention and Intervention Plan and funding new programs and services, including the Lethality Assessment Protocol, a public awareness campaign for the Latino community, and new direct service projects.
- PreventNet Community School Sites served nearly 6000 students in 2010 and 2011 YTD in 10 schools, providing one-on-one support and case coordination to "core" children/youth with identified risk factors and "universal" services and activities to any children/youth that wish to participate.
