WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Permits printing names of political parties and word 'incumbent,' if applicable, with candidate name on ballot, instead of specifying printing opposite or following candidate name. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Cost of ballot preparation
- Differences in complexity, accounting for all the various parts of ballots
- Concern about use of abbreviations becoming norm, instead of exception •
- Process for determining abbreviation for political party name
- Potential for voter confusion •

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Current law requires that the names of political parties and the word "incumbent," if applicable, be printed in particular places on ballots – opposite a candidate's name, and following a candidate's name. House Bill 4173 requires the same information be printed with a candidate's name.
