EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Gail Louise Achterman was born in Salem, Oregon, on August 1, 1949, and passed away on January 28, 2012. Ms. Achterman graduated from Stanford University with an A.B. in Economics and an M.S. in Natural Resources Policy and Management, and from University of Michigan and with a law degree. She had a long history of public service throughout her lifetime, serving as the Governor's natural resource advisor, a member and then Chair of the Oregon Transportation Commission, the first director of the Institute of Natural Resources and the Executive Director of the Deschutes Resources Conservancy. Her love of the natural world, particularly the Willamette Valley, was well-known. She was married to Charles McGinnis and had two stepsons, Daniel and Ryan. Senate Concurrent Resolution 207A honors Gail Louise Achterman.
