

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 4056

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 7, delete “seven” and insert “16”.

2 In line 8, delete “one member” and insert “two members”.

3 In line 10, delete “one member” and insert “two members”.

4 In line 12, delete “five” and insert “12”.

5 Delete lines 13 through 18 and insert:

6 “(A) Two members who represent industry involved in science, technology, engineering or
7 mathematics, one from a large corporation and one from a small business;

8 “(B) One member who represents the Engineering and Technology Industry Council;

9 “(C) One member who represents the Department of Education;

10 “(D) One member who represents kindergarten through grade 12 education as a career and
11 technical education teacher;

12 “(E) One member who represents community colleges as a career and technical education
13 teacher;

14 “(F) One member who represents universities as a science, technology, engineering or math-
15 ematics faculty member;

16 “(G) One member who represents universities as a provost;

17 “(H) Two members who represent organizations pursuing science, technology, engineering or
18 mathematics mentorships, internships and partnerships;

19 “(I) One high school student with an interest in science, technology, engineering or mathemat-
20 ics; and

21 “(J) One community college or university student majoring in a science, technology, engineering
22 or mathematics field.”.

23 On page 2, delete lines 30 through 35 and insert:

24 “(12)(a) Notwithstanding ORS 171.072, members of the task force who are members of the Leg-
25 islative Assembly are not entitled to mileage expenses or per diem payments and serve as volunteers
26 on the task force.

27 “(b) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not enti-
28 tled to compensation or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.”.

29 After line 39, insert:

30 “(14) The task force may accept donations of staff support, office space and equipment from
31 businesses and advocacy organizations to assist the task force in the performance of its
32 functions.”.
