**SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Adjusts, for six-year period beginning July 1, 2007, limitations on expenditures from specified sources collected or received by Oregon Department of Aviation for Chiloquin Apron Rehabilitation, Obstruction Removal and Lighting project.

Limits, for six-year period beginning July 1, 2011, expenditures from federal funds collected or received by Department of Transportation for construction of Oregon Wireless Interoperability Network project. **Limits, for six-year period beginning July 1, 2011, expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by department for acquisition of land and for field office in Bend.**

**Increases, for six-year period beginning July 1, 2011, limitation on expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by Department of Veterans' Affairs, for specified purposes. Limits, for six-year period beginning July 1, 2011, expenditures from federal funds collected or received by department for specified purposes.**

Limits, for six-year period beginning July 1, 2011, expenditures from Article XI-F(1) bond proceeds collected or received by Oregon University System for specified projects.

Limits, for six-year period beginning July 1, 2011, expenditures from lottery bond proceeds collected or received by Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development for specified projects.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

2 Relating to state financial administration; limiting expenditures; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on**  
5 **expenditures established by section 1 (10)(d), chapter 742, Oregon Laws 2007, for a six-year**  
6 **period beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees,**  
7 **moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and**  
8 **federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Department of Aviation for the Chiloquin**  
9 **Apron Rehabilitation, Obstruction Removal and Lighting project is increased by \$115,000.**

10 **(2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures**  
11 **established by section 2 (2)(d) chapter 742, Oregon Laws 2007, for a six-year period beginning**  
12 **July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for the expenditure of federal funds collected or received**  
13 **by the Oregon Department of Aviation for the Chiloquin Apron Rehabilitation, Obstruction**  
14 **Removal and Lighting project is increased by \$2,185,000.**

15 **SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$591,920**  
16 **is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limit for the ex-**  
17 **penditure of federal funds collected or received by the Department of Transportation for the**

1 acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing  
2 and equipping of buildings and facilities for the Oregon Wireless Interoperability Network  
3 project.

4 **SECTION 3.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of  
5 \$1,838,489 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limit  
6 for the payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous  
7 Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Depart-  
8 ment of Transportation for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, construct-  
9 ing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of buildings and facilities for the  
10 Department of Transportation field office in Bend.

11 **SECTION 4.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
12 expenditures established by section 1 (7)(a), chapter 615, Oregon Laws 2011, for a six-year  
13 period beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees,  
14 moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and  
15 federal funds, collected or received by the Department of Veterans' Affairs, for the acquisi-  
16 tion of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and  
17 equipping of buildings or facilities for the Lebanon Veterans' Home, is increased by  
18 \$10,126,096.

19 **SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of  
20 \$19,362,748 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limit  
21 for the expenditure of federal funds collected or received by the Department of Veterans'  
22 Affairs for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, re-  
23 pairing, furnishing and equipping of buildings and facilities for the Lebanon Veterans' Home.

24 **SECTION 6.** (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of  
25 \$42,700,000 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limit  
26 for payment of expenses under this section from Article XI-F(1) bond proceeds collected or  
27 received by the Oregon University System for the Student Experience Center project at  
28 Oregon State University.

29 (2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$29,000,000 is es-  
30 tablished for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limit for payment of  
31 expenses under this section from Article XI-F(1) bond proceeds collected or received by the  
32 Oregon University System for a new student residence project at Oregon State University.

33 (3) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$9,177,500 is es-  
34 tablished for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limit for payment of  
35 expenses under this section from Article XI-F(1) bond proceeds collected or received by the  
36 Oregon University System for the Memorial Union east wing renovation project at Oregon  
37 State University.

38 **SECTION 7.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of  
39 \$1,000,000 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limit  
40 for payment of expenses under this section from Article XI-F(1) bond proceeds collected or  
41 received by the Oregon University System for the Natural Sciences Laboratory Annex project  
42 at Western Oregon University, previously authorized in section 9 (8)(b), chapter 615, Oregon  
43 Laws 2011.

44 **SECTION 8.** Notwithstanding any other provision of this 2012 Act, the bond proceeds, the  
45 expenditures from which are limited by sections 6 and 7 of this 2012 Act, are not available

1 for expenditure before the effective date of this 2012 Act. However, any action taken by the  
2 State Board of Higher Education prior to the effective date of this 2012 Act or any contract  
3 entered into by the board prior to the effective date of this 2012 Act necessary for the ac-  
4 quisition, construction, improvement, repair, equipping and furnishing of buildings, struc-  
5 tures, land and other projects or parts thereof, authorized by sections 6 and 7 of this 2012  
6 Act, is hereby authorized.

7 **SECTION 9.** Notwithstanding the expenditure limitations established under section 7 of  
8 this 2012 Act and section 9, chapter 615, Oregon Laws 2011, the State Board of Higher Edu-  
9 cation may increase the limit for expenditures from other revenues, including federal funds,  
10 prescribed by section 9 (8)(b), chapter 615, Oregon Laws 2011, for the Natural Sciences Lab-  
11 oratory Annex project at Western Oregon University, if the expenditure limitation for bonds  
12 issued pursuant to Article XI-F(1) of the Oregon Constitution for the same project is reduced  
13 by the board in the same amount.

14 **SECTION 10.** For purposes of section 1, Article XI-F(1) of the Oregon Constitution, the  
15 Legislative Assembly determines that the projects authorized to be financed pursuant to  
16 sections 6 and 7 of this 2012 Act with bonds issued under Article XI-F(1) of the Oregon  
17 Constitution will benefit higher education institutions or activities.

18 **SECTION 11.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts  
19 are established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limit for pay-  
20 ment of expenses under this section from lottery bond proceeds collected or received by the  
21 Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development pursuant to section 2,  
22 chapter \_\_\_\_\_, Oregon Laws 2012 (Enrolled House Bill 5201), for community college dis-  
23 tricts for capital construction, deferred maintenance, capital renewal, code compliance and  
24 safety projects:

**SECTION 12.** This 2012 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2012 Act takes effect on its passage.
