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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Adjusts, for biennium beginning July 1, 2011, specified allocations from Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to specified state agencies. **Increases amount of lottery bond debt service obligations that Oregon Department of Administrative Services must satisfy if fund moneys are insufficient to pay for certain allocations.**

Decreases, for biennium beginning July 1, 2011, specified allocation from Criminal Fine Assessment Account and Criminal Fine Account.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to state financial administration; creating new provisions; amending section 7, chapter 622,
3 Oregon Laws 2011; and declaring an emergency.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1. (1) Notwithstanding any other law allocating moneys from the Administra-**
6 **tive Services Economic Development Fund, the allocation to the Oregon Business Develop-**
7 **ment Department established by section 3 (1), chapter 622, Oregon Laws 2011, for the**
8 **biennium beginning July 1, 2011, is decreased by \$139,171.**

9 **(2) Notwithstanding any other law allocating moneys from the Administrative Services**
10 **Economic Development Fund, the allocation to the Oregon Business Development Depart-**
11 **ment established by section 3 (2), chapter 622, Oregon Laws 2011, for the biennium beginning**
12 **July 1, 2011, is decreased by \$293,896.**

13 **(3) Notwithstanding any other law allocating moneys from the Administrative Services**
14 **Economic Development Fund, the allocation to the Oregon Business Development Depart-**
15 **ment established by section 3 (3), chapter 622, Oregon Laws 2011, for the biennium beginning**
16 **July 1, 2011, is decreased by \$81,315.**

17 **SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law allocating moneys from the Administrative**
18 **Services Economic Development Fund, the allocation to the Department of Education, for**
19 **the State School Fund, established by section 4, chapter 622, Oregon Laws 2011, for the**
20 **biennium beginning July 1, 2011, is decreased by \$2,979,570.**

21 **SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law allocating moneys from the Administrative**
22 **Services Economic Development Fund, the allocation to the office of the Governor estab-**
23 **lished by section 6, chapter 622, Oregon Laws 2011, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011,**
24 **is decreased by \$943.**

NOTE: Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

1 **SECTION 4.** Section 7, chapter 622, Oregon Laws 2011, is amended to read:

2 **Sec. 7.** (1) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall establish a process for al-
3 locating available moneys in the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund on a quar-
4 terly basis to fulfill the biennial allocations made by *[this 2011 Act]* **chapter 622, Oregon Laws**
5 **2011**. The department shall set the quarterly allocations.

6 (2) If, in any quarter, the moneys transferred from the State Lottery Fund to the Administrative
7 Services Economic Development Fund are insufficient to pay for the quarterly allocations made by
8 *[this 2011 Act]* **chapter 622, Oregon Laws 2011**, prior to making any other allocations pursuant to
9 *[this 2011 Act]* **chapter 622, Oregon Laws 2011**, the department shall satisfy lottery bond debt ser-
10 vice obligations in the amount of *[\$240,443,627]* **\$248,243,839**, as follows:

11 (a) For outstanding lottery bonds [\$ 238,307,273]

12 **\$ 246,353,489**

13 (b) For lottery bonds to be issued [\$ 2,136,354]

14 **\$ 1,890,350**

15 (3) After the lottery bond debt service obligations described in subsection (2) of this section are
16 satisfied, if the remaining moneys transferred from the State Lottery Fund to the Administrative
17 Services Economic Development Fund are insufficient to pay for the quarterly allocations made by
18 *[this 2011 Act]* **chapter 622, Oregon Laws 2011**, the department shall reduce allocations propor-
19 tionately in amounts sufficient to accommodate the revenue shortfall.

20 **SECTION 5.** (1) Notwithstanding any other law allocating moneys from the Administra-
21 tive Services Economic Development Fund, the allocation to the Oregon Department of Ad-
22 ministrative Services, established by section 8 (1), chapter 622, Oregon Laws 2011, for the
23 biennium beginning July 1, 2011, is increased by \$8,046,216.

24 (2) Notwithstanding any other law allocating moneys from the Administrative Services
25 Economic Development Fund, the allocation to the Oregon Department of Administrative
26 Services, established by section 8 (2), chapter 622, Oregon Laws 2011, for the biennium be-
27 ginning July 1, 2011, is decreased by \$246,004.

28 **SECTION 6.** Notwithstanding any other law allocating moneys from the Administrative
29 Services Economic Development Fund, the allocation to the Sports Lottery Account estab-
30 lished by section 9, chapter 622, Oregon Laws 2011, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011,
31 is decreased by \$232,960.

32 **SECTION 7.** Notwithstanding any other law allocating moneys from the Administrative
33 Services Economic Development Fund, the allocation to the Problem Gambling Treatment
34 Fund, established by section 11, chapter 622, Oregon Laws 2011, for the biennium beginning
35 July 1, 2011, is decreased by \$390,969.

36 **SECTION 8.** Notwithstanding any other law allocating moneys from the Criminal Fine
37 and Assessment Account and the Criminal Fine Account, the allocation to the Department
38 of Public Safety Standards and Training established by section 54, chapter 597, Oregon Laws
39 2011, for the period beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, for the purpose of
40 criminal justice training and standards operations, is decreased by \$873,897.

41 **SECTION 9.** This 2012 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
42 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2012 Act takes effect
43 on its passage.
