

Senate Concurrent Resolution 212

Sponsored by Senator COURTNEY, Representatives HANNA, ROBLAN

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes deadlines for pre-session-filed legislative measures for 2013 regular session of Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly.

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

(1) This resolution constitutes a rule of proceeding of the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly.

(2) All requests to prepare drafts of measures must be accompanied by a brief summary of the problem sought to be addressed, the proposed solution to the problem and any other relevant information about the proposed measure.

(3) The Senate and the House of Representatives shall adhere to the following schedule and deadlines for pre-session-filed measures for the 2013 regular session of the Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly:

(a) Members and committees shall submit requests for drafts of measures to be pre-session-filed to the Office of the Legislative Counsel on or before 5 p.m. on September 17, 2012.

(b) The Office of the Legislative Counsel shall deliver drafts of measures to be pre-session-filed to requesters on or before 5 p.m. on December 7, 2012.

(c) Requesters shall submit drafts of measures to be pre-session-filed for introduction to the Senate Desk or the House Desk no later than 5 p.m. on December 28, 2012.

(4) The President of the Senate, the House Committee on Rules and the Joint Committee on Ways and Means are not subject to the deadlines described in subsection (3) of this resolution.

(5) The rules of the Senate and the House of Representatives apply to matters not specified in this resolution and take precedence over matters specified in this resolution.

NOTE: Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.
