#### **Public Hearing**

HB 2525

FIRST PUBLIC HEARING: Permits person to bring action against insurer or other person that commits unlawful insurance practice.

HB 2929

FIRST PUBLIC HEARING: Provides penalty of \$500 for trustee's failure to give notice of trustee's sale postponement in accordance with requirements.

HB 2936

FIRST PUBLIC HEARING: Prohibits financial institution from selling, sharing, transferring or otherwise disclosing consumer's personal financial information to unaffiliated party without first receiving consumer's explicit consent.

HB 3160

FIRST PUBLIC HEARING: Includes insurance in definition of real estate, goods and services that are subject to penalties for unlawful trade practices.

HB 2824

Clarifies that tower does not need to contact owner of parking facility or owner's agent at time of tow before towing motor vehicle from facility if sign warning that parking is prohibited is posted or if motor vehicle is parked next to red or yellow curb.

HB 3159

Directs Oregon Transportation Commission to set maximum rates for towing and related services when tower tows motor vehicle without consent or authorization of owner or operator.

#### Work Session

HB 2346

Provides that enrolled customer consents to receive notice of modification or termination of portable electronics insurance policy by electronic means if, after insurer, insurer's agent or vendor that sold portable electronics notifies enrolled customer that providing electronic mail address to insurer, insurer's agent or vendor is consent to receive notice by electronic means, enrolled customer provides electronic mail address.

## AGENDA (Cont.) March 14, 2013

HB 2568

Provides that in amended notice of sale following release from stay on foreclosure proceedings, trustee must descrit only defaults that existed on date stay was terminated if portion of defaults specified in original notice of sale was cured during stay or if additional defaults have occurred during stay.

HB 2569

Allows law practices to serve as trustees of trust deeds.
