HB 3407 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/8/2013 AGENDA: Establishes Traditional Health Workers Commission within Oregon Health Authority to adopt by rule criteria and descriptions for coordinated care organizations to use with respect to health workers who are not licensed by this state and training and education requirements for those workers.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 3420 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING: Requires Oregon Health Authority to investigate possibility of receiving federal approval to implement copayments or other mechanisms to encourage medical assistance recipients to take personal responsibility for their own health and health care.

HB 2020
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING: Requires coordinated care organizations to accept credentials of mental health treatment providers and chemical dependency treatment providers found by another coordinated care organization to meet credentialing requirements and objective quality standards.

HB 3345
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING: Provides for regulation of persons that engage in recovery or distribution of anatomical material from donors.

HB 2093 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING: Makes changes to provisions of law related to vital statistics to reflect 2011 Revision to Model State Vital Statistics Act.

HB 2088
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING: Requires Oregon Health Authority to submit written report on legislative changes that will need to be made during 2015 regular session of Legislative Assembly to reflect budgetary changes.

HB 2085
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING: Requires Oregon Health Authority to submit written report on legislative changes that will need to be made during 2015 regular session of Legislative Assembly to align state law with federal laws concerning public health and publicly funded health programs.

- HB 3162 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires Oregon Health Authority to maintain list of designated high priority chemicals of concern for children's health used in children's products.
- HB 3260 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires Oregon Health Authority to conduct study or contract with third party to study and recommend best option for financing health care in state.
- HB 2767
Requires Public Employees' Benefit Board to conduct pilot project to study effects on employee health of using walking workstations.
- HB 2076
Requires covered entities to report annually on system safeguards for protecting confidentiality of individually identifiable health information.
