Requires Oregon Health Authority to conduct study or contract with third party to study and recommend best optior for financing health care in state.

HB 2767

Requires Public Employees' Benefit Board to conduct pilot project to study effects on employee health of using walking workstations.

HB 2076

Requires covered entities to report annually on system safeguards for protecting confidentiality of individually identifiable health information.
