HB 2114

FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Provides that evidence of test administered, or observation made, by police officer as part of drug recognition evaluation is admissible in judicial or administrative proceeding if certain conditions are met.

HB 2115

FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Expands offense of driving while under influence of intoxicants to include any drug that adversely affects person's physical or mental faculties to noticeable or perceptible degree.

HB 2116

FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Authorizes court to provide medical exemption to person otherwise required to install ignition interlock device as part of driving while under influence of intoxicants diversion agreement if person meets requirements established by Department of Transportation by rule.

HB 2117

FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Extends suspension of driving privileges beyond end of suspension or revocation period if person fails to submit proof of installation or maintain installation of required ignition interlock device.

HB 2121

FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Authorizes court to issue notice to Department of Transportation if defendant is convicted of driving under influence of intoxicants and fails to comply with court-ordered treatment.

HB 2052 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Increases fee paid to certain agencies and organizations for diagnostic assessment required for possession of marijuana diversion agreement.
