- HB 3363
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/09/2013 AGENDA - Requires Department of Human Services to disclose case plan and written information to court appointed special advocate in juvenile dependency proceedings.
- HB 2668
Expands definition of "place of public accommodation" to include places owned or maintained by public body and services provided by public body.
- HB 2834
Enacts Revised Uniform Law on Notarial Acts.
- HB 3047
Extends length of suspension of driving privileges if person fails to pay fine or obey order of court from 10 years to 20 years.
