Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- HB 2204
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Requires crimes related to oxycodone, hydrocodone or methadone that involve substantial quantity or that constitute commercial drug offense to be classified as crime category 8 of sentencing guideline grid.
- HB 2362
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Allows person against whom stalking protective order was entered to file motion with court to enter order to seal records related to stalking protective order if certain conditions are met.
- HB 2408
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Modifies crime of endangering the welfare of a minor.
- HB 2431
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Creates defense to prostitution for person under 18 years of age.
- HB 2549 **
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Directs Department of Corrections to establish risk assessment tool applicable to sex offenders. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- HB 2552
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Eliminates obligation to report as sex offender if person is required to report solely as result of juvenile court adjudication for act committed when person was under 16 years of age.
- HB 3467
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Requires individual seeking disclosure of photographic records of arrested person from law enforcement agency to submit written request to agency, in person and with payment of fees.

Work Session

- HB 2115
Expands offense of driving while under influence of intoxicants to include any drug that adversely affects person's physical or mental faculties to noticeable or perceptible degree.
- HB 2601
Repeals restriction on use of photographs taken using photo red light camera.
- HB 2962
Requires court finding of prejudice for violations of speedy trial requirement.

HB 3277

Allows prosecuting attorneys 90 days after sentencing to present restitution information to court.
