Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 3465

FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Gives tourist facility landlord immunity from liability under certain circumstances during term of rental agreement or lease providing for tenant to occupy tourist facility and operate organizational camp.

HB 3478

FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Exempts claims based on conduct that constitutes child abuse, or conduct that constitutes knowingly allowing, permitting or encouraging child abuse, from notice requirement of Oregon Tort Claims Act.

Work Session

HB 2226

Prohibits court hearing change of name application from requiring notice of application and judgment if applicant is participant in Address Confidentiality Program, unless good cause exists.

HB 2668

Expands definition of "place of public accommodation" to include places owned or maintained by public body and services provided by public body.

HB 3201 A

Allows person holding interest in property to recover economic and property damages resulting from fire occurring due to certain statutory or rule violations or resulting from fire escaping from land used or capable of being used for growing forest tree species.

HB 2581

Increases amount of noneconomic damages that may be awarded in civil action seeking damages arising out of bodily injury.

HB 2944

Adopts Uniform Electronic Legal Material Act.

HB 3282

Requires trial court to issue written orders in certain victims' rights proceedings.

HB 3287

Requires party in post-conviction relief proceeding to disclose witness information to opposing party at least 90 day prior to hearing.

HB 3286

Eliminates transcription requirement for warrants based on sworn oral statements.
