HB 2150 A

Modifies contents of and process for proposal to establish public charter school.

HB 2875

Provides that expiring charter remains in effect for public charter school until new charter is negotiated following approval of renewal of charter.

HB 2970 A

Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to develop standards related to requirements for associate transfer degree .

HB 2913
