Possible Introduction of Committee Measures

Work Session

- SB 74
Changes calculation of present value of adjusted premiums for certain types of life insurance so that present value of all adjusted premiums equals 50 percent of adjusted premium for first policy year instead of 40 percent of adjusted premium for first policy year.
- SB 143 **
Establishes Office of Small Business Assistance in Office of Secretary of State for purpose of facilitating interactions between small businesses and state agencies with regulatory authority over small businesses. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 574
Permits consumer to request that consumer reporting agency place, temporarily lift or remove security freeze on protected consumer's consumer report if consumer provides sufficient proof of consumer's authority to act on protected consumer's behalf.
- SB 686
Includes insurance in definition of real estate, goods and services that are subject to penalties for unlawful trade practices.
- SB 414
Permits Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to seek restitution on behalf of consumer that suffered actual damages as result of insurer's violation of Insurance Code or breach of insurance contract or policy and to seek other equitable relief that director deems appropriate under circumstances.
- SB 416
Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to provide complaint process for challenging actions or credentials of independent review organization and to enforce requirements for external reviews.
- SB 91
Allows landlord to charge fee described in rental agreement when, contrary to written rules or policies, tenant keeps on premises pet capable of causing damage to persons or property.
- SB 577
Adds specifications for service contracts and vehicle protection products that are subject to regulation.

Requires entities that use public financing for capital construction to report to Legislative Assembly on use of local goods, services and labor.
