Possible Introduction of Committee Measures

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- SB 56
Decreases penalty for crime of cheating to maximum of one year's imprisonment, \$6,250 fine, or both.
- SB 58
Reduces minimum duration of special alternative incarceration program from 270 days to 240 days.
- SB 61
Repeals obsolete provision relating to jury trials in county courts.
- SB 64
Increases time for conducting preliminary hearing on minor's application for emancipation to 15 days after date of filing.
- SB 794
Requires Advisory Committee on Medical Marijuana to meet five times per year.

Work Session

- SB 54
Defines "digital accounts" and "digital assets" for purposes of administration of estates and trusts.
- SB 90
Modifies certification system for shorthand reporters.
- SB 417
Requires corrections officer to report abuse of inmate to Department of Corrections or sheriff and to Attorney General.
- SB 492
Requires district attorney to disclose to defendant data, documents, tangible objects or information that reasonably appears to be favorable to defendant with respect to determination of guilt, preliminary matter or sentence to be imposed.

AGENDA (Cont.)
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- SB 610
Modifies types of conditions qualifying as disability and types of animals qualifying as assistance animals for purposes of accessing places of public accommodation and places of access to state government services, programs activities and for purposes of cause of action for harm to assistance animal.
- SB 695
Modifies provisions relating to mandamus actions.
- SB 798
Allows court to replace juror with alternate juror in criminal case after jury begins deliberations in certain circumstances.
- SB 799
Requires order of court to change attorney, or to terminate relationship of attorney and client, in action or proceeding
- SB 815
Provides that agri-tourism provider is not liable for injury to or death of participant arising out of inherent risks of agri-tourism activities if agri-tourism provider posts certain notices.
- SB 851
Directs Public Utility Commission to appoint executive director of Oregon Board of Maritime Pilots.
