HB 2121 A

Requires person who has been convicted of driving while under influence of intoxicants to provide proof to Department of Transportation that person has completed required treatment program.

HB 2334 A

Modifies crime of compelling prostitution.

HB 2601 A

Modifies restriction on use of photographs taken using photo red light camera.

HB 2986 A

Permits court, after suspension of driving privileges for failure to pay fine, to reinstate person's driving privileges if person is enrolled in preapprenticeship program or is registered as apprentice.

HB 2962 A

Repeals statute requiring trial within reasonable period of time for criminal defendants.

HB 3277 A

Allows prosecuting attorneys 90 days after sentencing to present restitution information to court.
