SB 699 – Senate Judiciary Committee April 5, 2013 By Maurice K. Sanders

- 1 My name is Maurice K. Sanders. I am a resident of Dunes City which is located on the coast in western
- 2 Lane County. I am an honorably retired law enforcement officer with 28 years of service. Additionally I
- 3 served honorably in the United States Army in the Military Police. I retired over a year ago as the Chief
- 4 of Police for the City of Florence, Oregon. I am also an elected city councilor for the City of Dunes City
- 5 however my comments today are not those of the Dunes City Council or the citizens of City of Dunes
- 6 City. I am providing my own thoughts, beliefs, and opinions only. I am authorized to carry a concealable
- 7 firearm upon my person pursuant to the Federal Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act which is
- 8 commonly referred to as "HR 218". I am not licensed or permitted to carry a concealed firearm pursuant
- 9 to Oregon law.
- 10 I am supportive of this bill with the proposed amendments. I was initially neutral on this bill when it was
- 11 introduced as I have no interest in carrying a firearm, concealed or otherwise, into the capitol. The
- 12 legislature could maintain the initial ban of firearms and provide handgun lockers so persons could
- secure their firearm, conduct their business in the capitol building, then as they leave they could retrieve
- their firearms, just like is done with law enforcement officers entering jails.
- 15 However setting that neutrality aside at that when the Proposed Amendment to Senate bill 699 (SB 699
- 16 1) came out, I was happy to see that persons who carry concealed firearms who are not licensed under
- ORS 166.291 and 166.292, but authorized to do so under the Federal Law Enforcement Officers Safety
- 18 Act which is commonly referred to as "HR 218", is now recognized and will constitute an affirmative
- 19 defense for violation of ORS 166.370 (1), (2)(a)(A) and (B).
- 20 When the Proposed Amendment to Senate Bill 699 (SB 699 3) came out, I saw that the proposed law
- 21 now says that people with a CHL could have their handgun with them provided the firearm is completely
- 22 concealed from view. This bill does make it illegal for any person from bringing a rifle or shotgun into the
- capitol except for the obvious exceptions for law enforcement, which in my opinion is appropriate.
