## MAJOR CHALLENGES AND DECISION POINTS

- 1. Effective January 2013, administration of the Oregon Homecare Insurance Program (OHIP) moved under the Oregon Health Authority (OHA). This new OHA program operates under the management and guidance of OEBB staff and is able to use OEBB's online benefit management system, MyOEBB. Under an agreement with the Department of Human Services (DHS), OHA will administer the benefit plans for homecare workers. The funding is transferred from DHS. The Governor's budget includes three limited duration positions and an increase of \$85.3 million in Other Funds Nonlimited authority to account for the pass-through of insurance premiums.
- 2. In January 2013, PEBB began paying an incentive for participating in the Health Engagement Model (HEM). The Governor's budget includes an additional \$40 million in Other Funds Nonlimited authority assuming the HEM incentive payments are continued through the duration of the 2013-15 biennium under the current incentive plan design.
