The purpose of this memorandum is to outline those agencies scheduled for Phase-II hearings, the general instructions provided to the agencies for these hearings, and specific issues that the Subcommittee asked be discussed.

The general instructions to Phase-II agencies are to:

- Review the budget details, including descriptions of essential and policy option packages,
- Identify any policy bills that are needed to support policy packages,
- Review state agency assessments increases,
- Review latest quarterly long-term vacancy data, and
- Review agency 10% reduction options.

The following are specific issues that agencies are prepared to discuss during their Phase-II hearings. Most of these issues are associated with specific policy options package requests.
