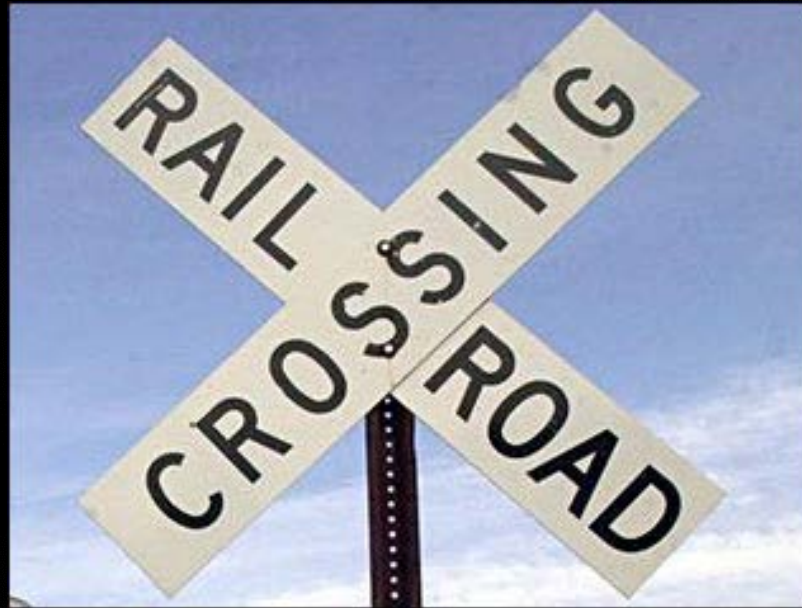

Hate crimes add an element of bias to traditional crimes—and the mixture is toxic to our communities.

Crimes of hatred and prejudice—from lynchings to cross burnings to vandalism of synagogues—are a sad fact of American history, but the term “hate crime” did not enter the nation’s vocabulary until the 1980s, when emerging hate groups like the Skinheads launched a wave of bias-related crime. The FBI began investigating what we now call hate crimes as far back as World War I, when the Ku Klux Klan first attracted our attention. Today, we remain dedicated to working with state and local partners to prevent these crimes and to bring to justice those who commit them.

4 face hate crime charges

A Eugene man and three teens are accused of threatening and chasing a biracial teen in Springfield

Booster, 22, was driving a pickup that flew a Confederate flag as its occupants yelled racial slurs and threatened violence upon the **15-year-old boy**.

The teen told investigators that the pickup's driver tried to run him over in a parking lot before the occupants — identified by police as Booster and three local teenagers — exited the vehicle and chased after him on foot.

The victim hid in a bush until his mother arrived and took him directly to the Springfield Police Department.

Hate Crime Index

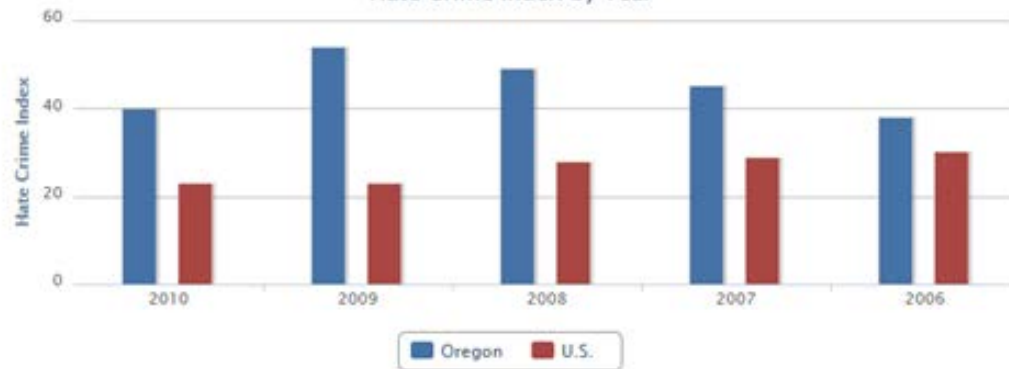


The hate crime index value is calculated based on the data using USA.com algorithms. It is an indicator of the hate crime level in a region. Higher hate crime index value means more hate crime.

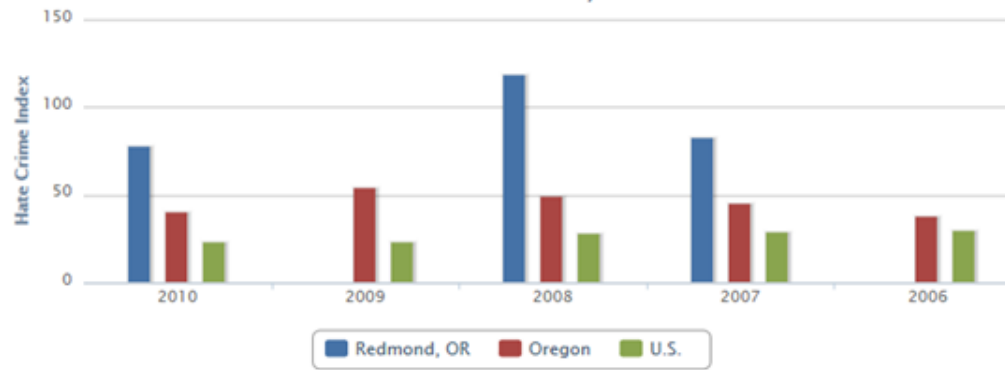
