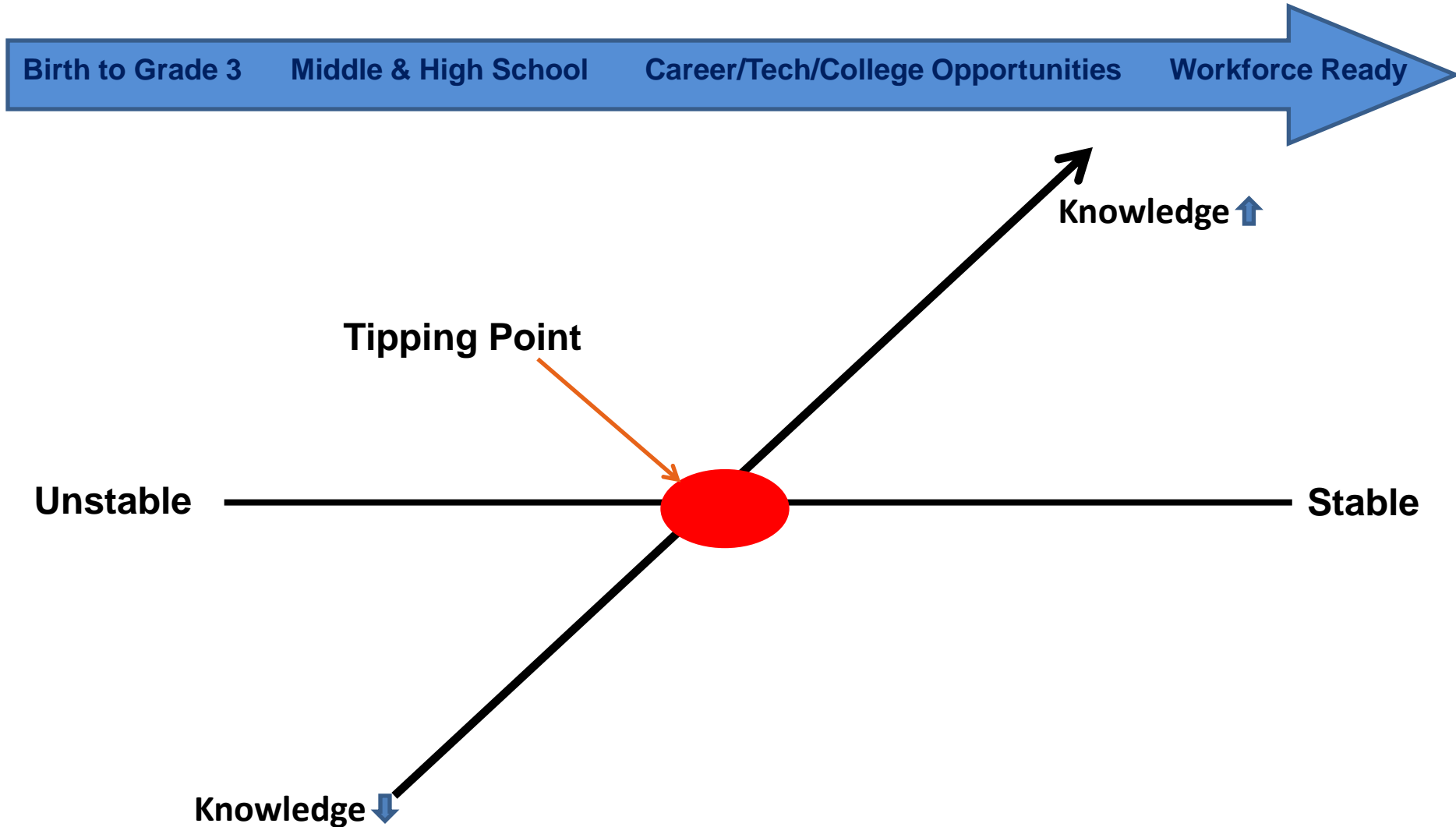
# Strategic Investments

The Governor and Chief Education Officer recommend, as a high priority, the funding of three strategic investments, totaling roughly \$34.2 million, specifically intended to:

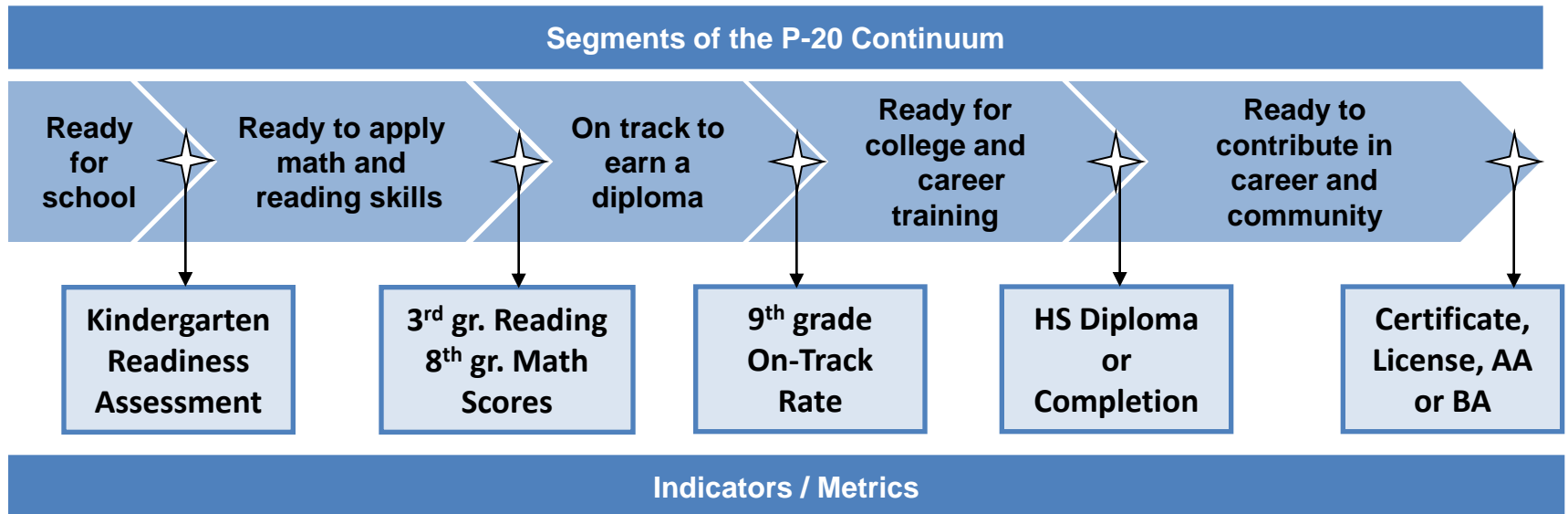
- **Rapidly improve performance** on several key measures of progress, including Kindergarten readiness, 3<sup>rd</sup> grade reading proficiency, 9<sup>th</sup> grade progress toward graduation, high school completion, and college enrollment.
- **Decrease the achievement gap** that exists between historically underserved populations and white Oregonians on the key measures; and
- **Increase levels of educational attainment and employability** for Oregonians.
- **Drive more prepared students** into the pipeline for career, tech, and college opportunities (40-40-20)

*197 School Districts, 19 ESDs, 7 Universities, 17 Community Colleges, and numerous Early Learning providers*



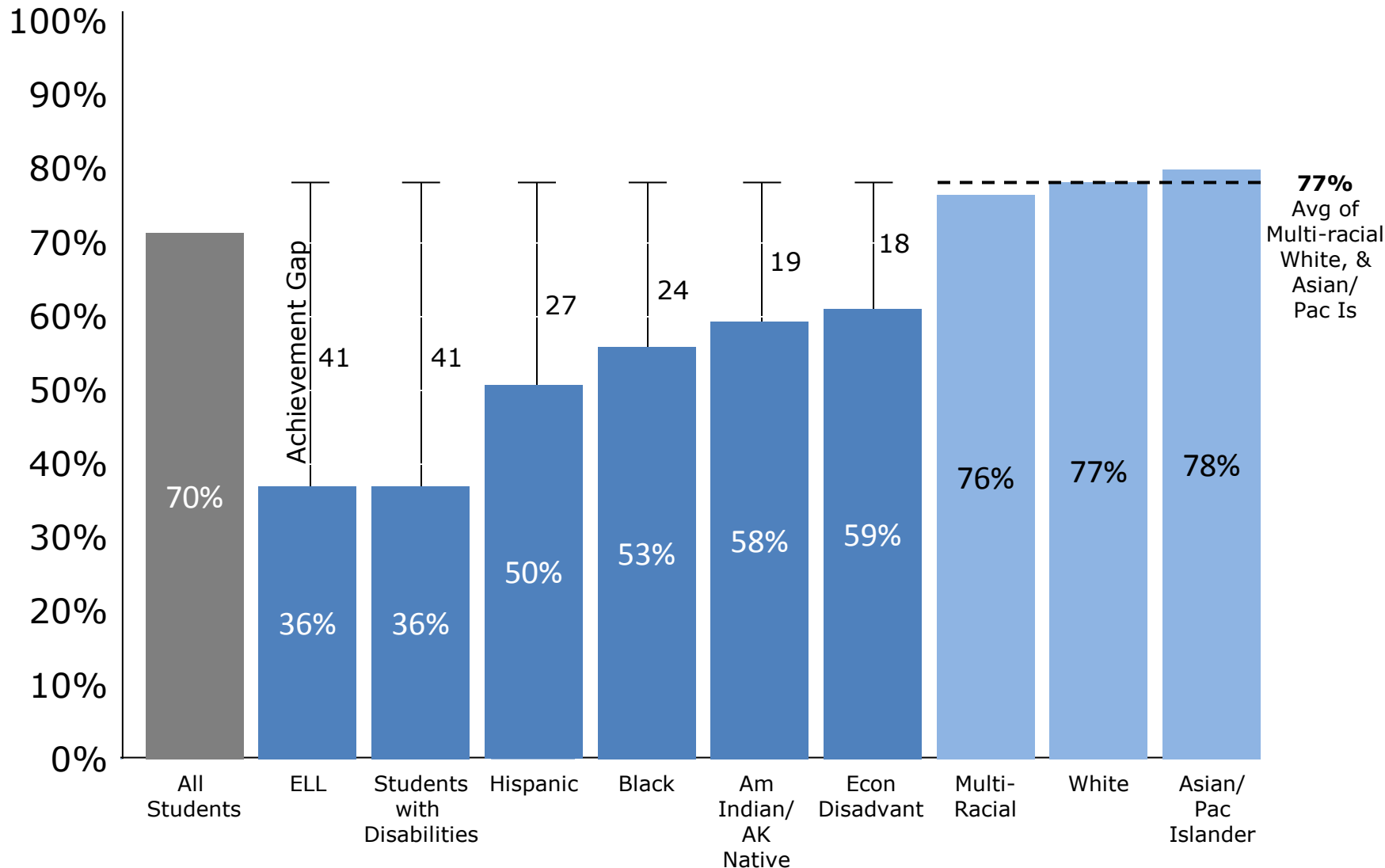

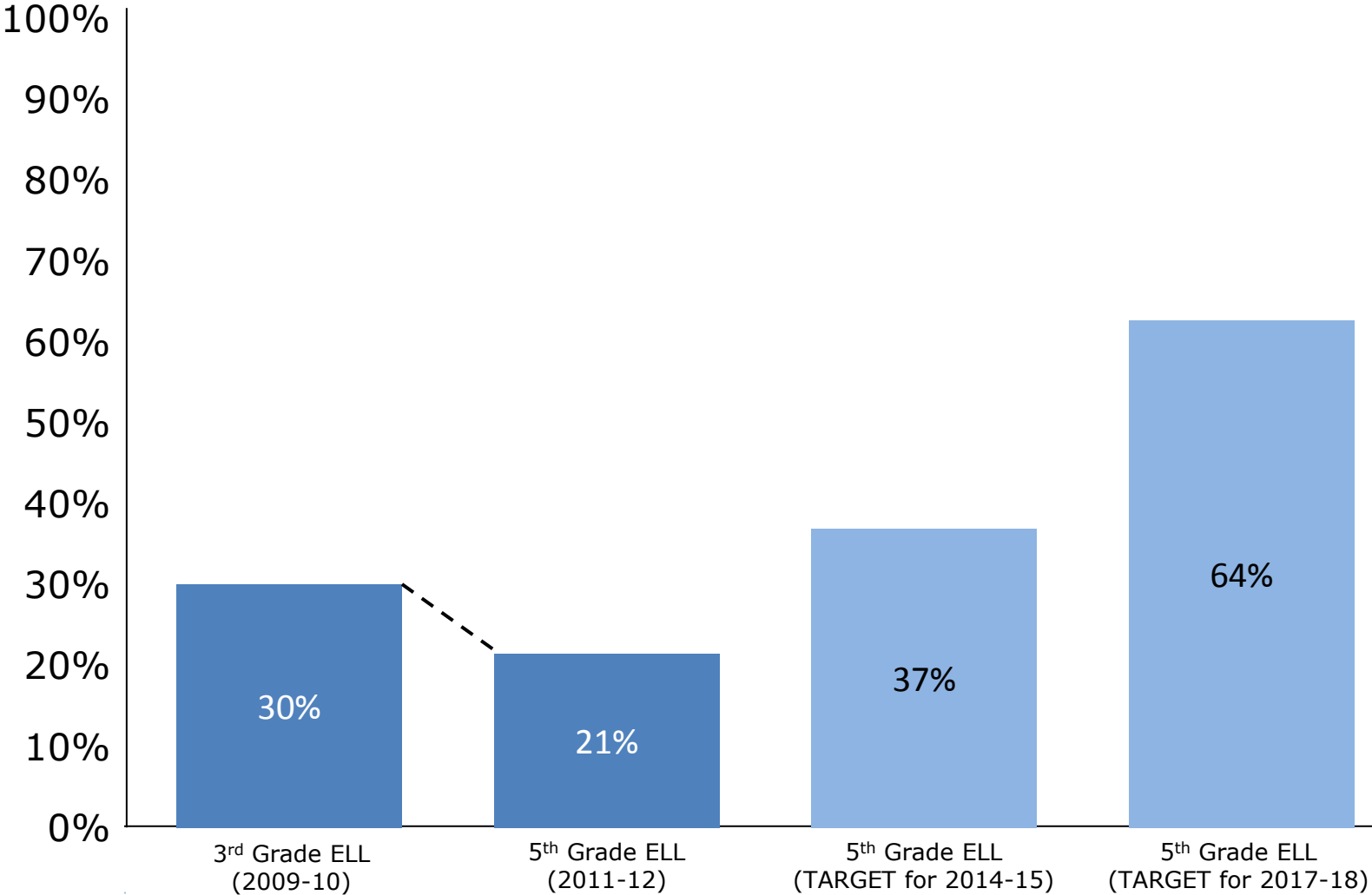

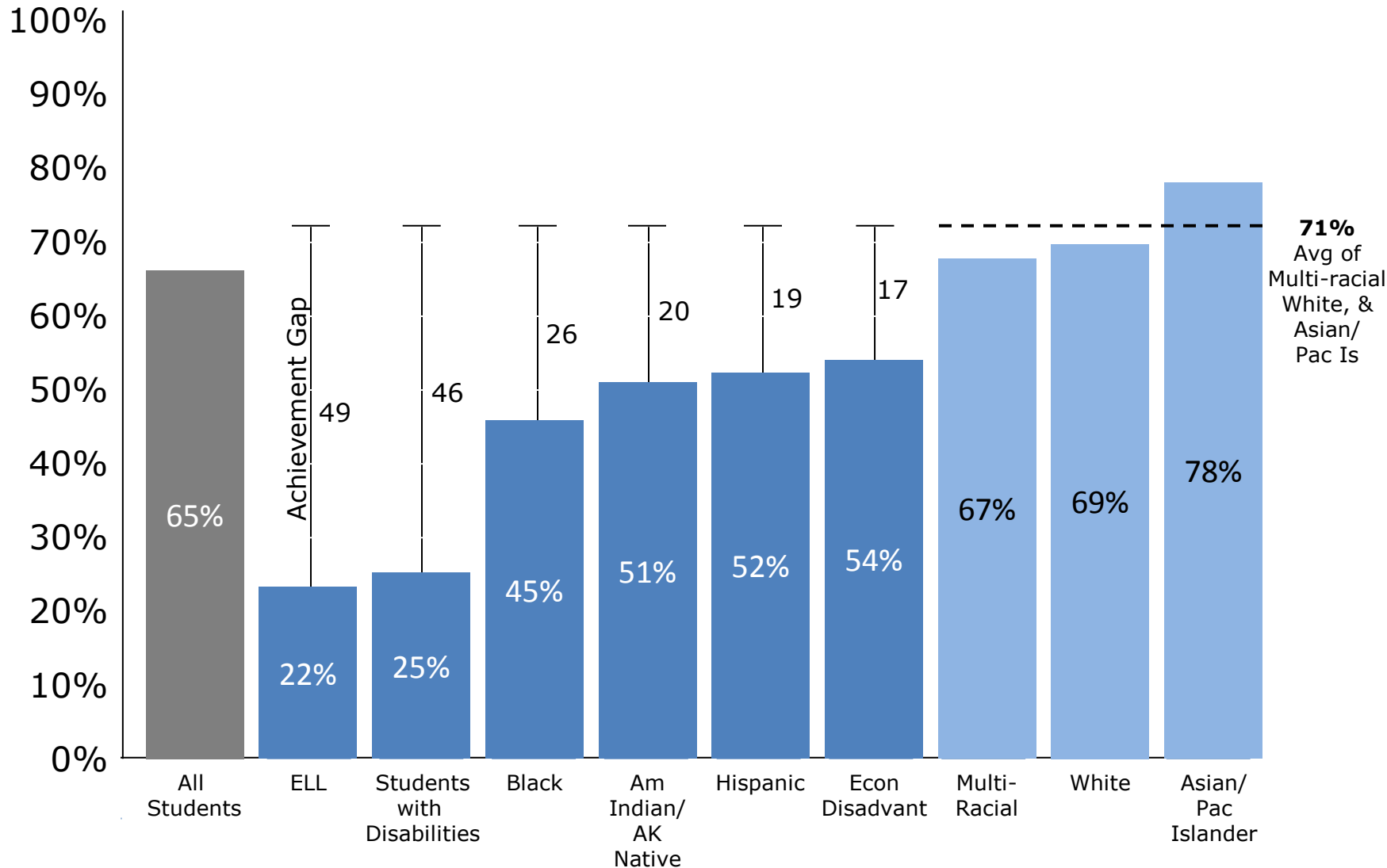
## Percent of students who met/exceeded benchmark (3<sup>rd</sup> Grade Reading, 2011-12)



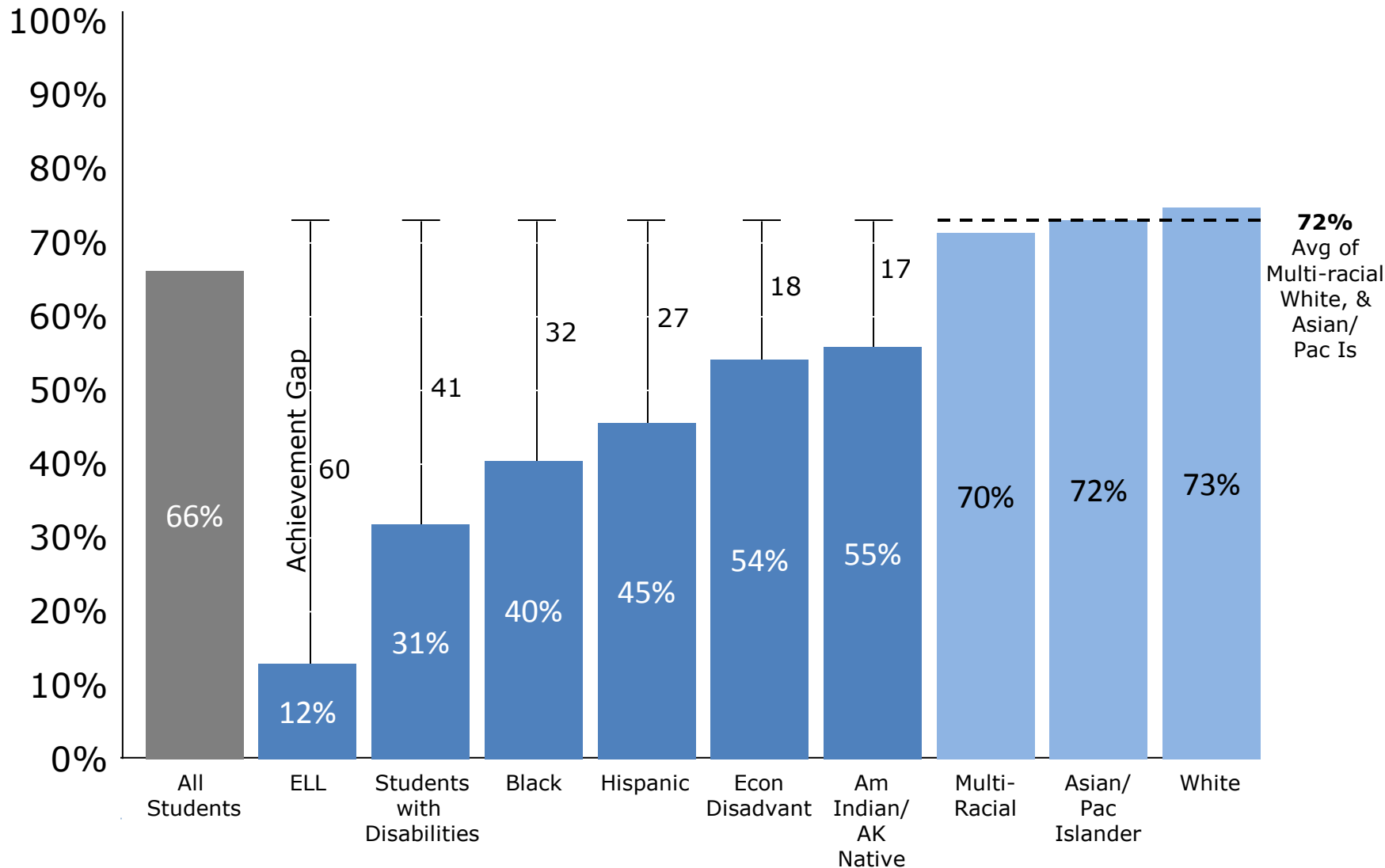
# Percent of ELL students who met/exceeded benchmark (3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Reading)



## Percent of students who met/exceeded benchmark (8<sup>th</sup> Grade Math, 2011-12)

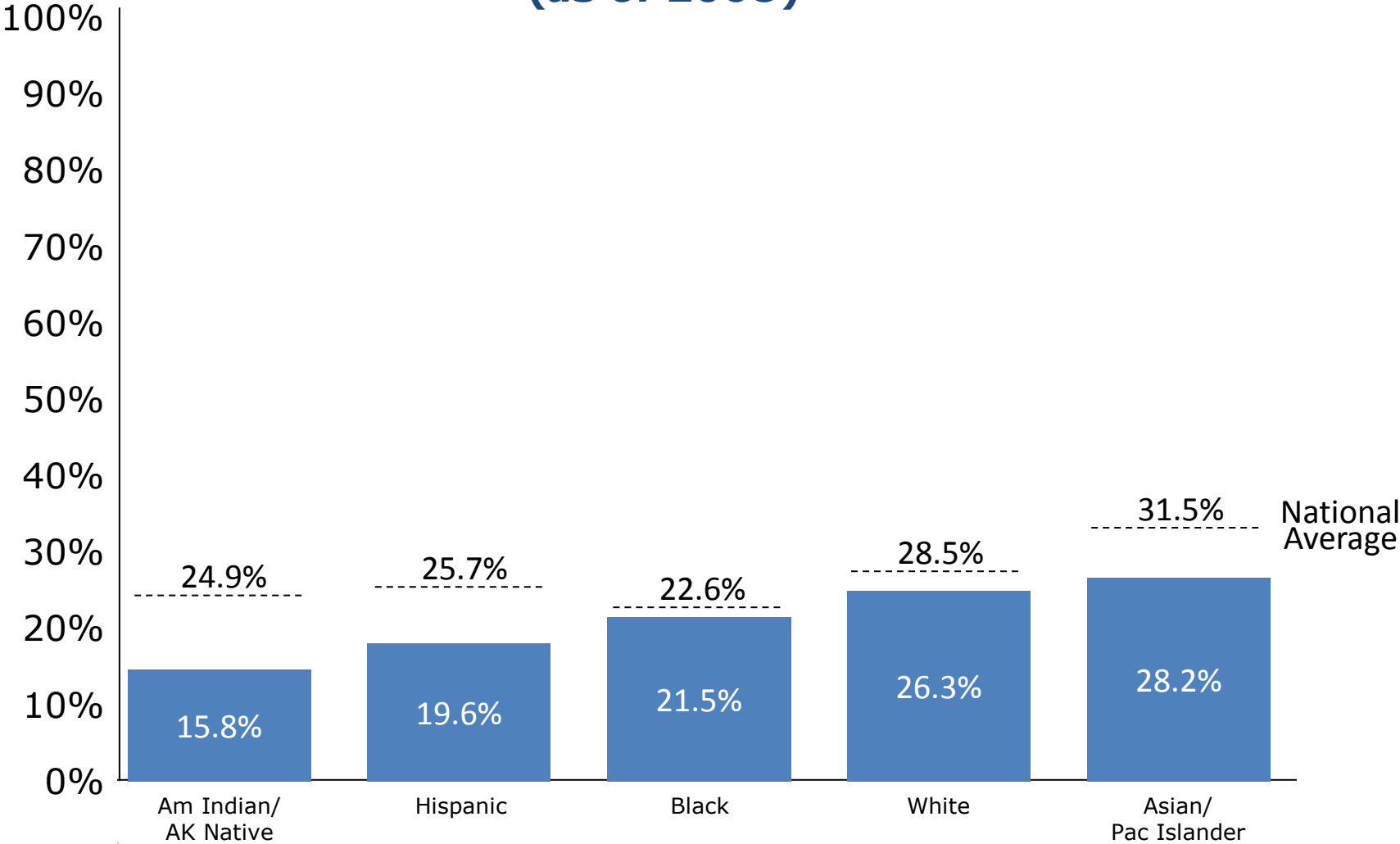


## Percent of students who met/exceeded benchmark (8<sup>th</sup> Grade Science, 2011-12)



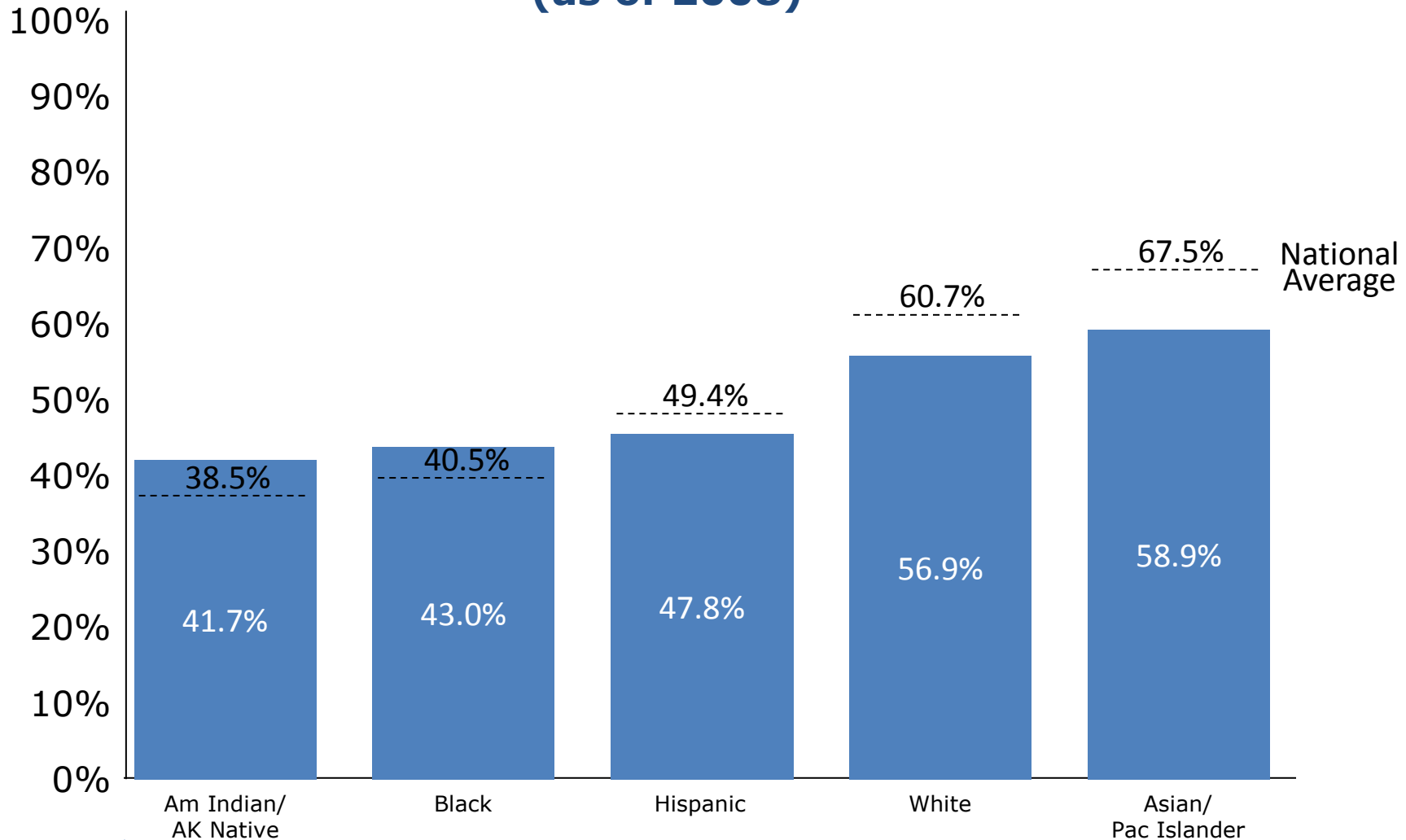


# Oregon Three-Year Graduation Rates at Two-Year Colleges (as of 2008)
