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## AP Participation Growth 2001-2012

Growth in AP participation and success in Oregon public high school students has doubled since 2001


## 2011-12 AP Student Statistics

- Over 2,500 newly admitted freshman brought in AP credit
- Over 35,000 college credits were earned by students
- Oregonians saved approximately \$6 million*
- Each student saved, on average, close to $\mathbf{\$ 2 , 5 0 0 *}$

## 2011-2012 OUS Dual Credit Statistics

- Approximately 3,500 high school students took part in OUS Dual
Credit programs
- Over 30,000 college credits were earned
- Oregonians saved approximately \$5 million*
- Each student saved, on average about \$1,400*


## Benefits for students who participate in Oregon Dual Credit Programs

|  | Students who <br> took Dual Credit | Students who did not <br> take Dual Credit |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| Graduates who enroll in college <br> (2- and 4-year) | $81.4 \%$ | $72.6 \%$ |
| Continue onto second year of <br> college | $87 \%$ | $79.9 \%$ |
| Average freshman GPA | 3.13 | 2.97 |
| Accumulate college credit at the <br> start of second fall term | 61.3 credits | 49.8 credits |
