I went onto the Oregon State website today to check on the status of State Bills 838 and 401. It took a lot longer than it should to find out any information about it and finally I discovered that there is another hearing on Wednesday, April 17th. I have been saving up for the past three years so that I may go down to Oregon, making sure that my gear is in good working order, and preparing to spend a lot of time and money in your fine state. We have gotten to the point of being able to leave when we were alerted to these bills. These leave me heartbroken.

There have been many studies of how or if suction dredging is harmful to the environment. It actually assists the environment. It brings up food for the fish and wildlife to eat. We, as miners, also remove lead and mercury from the waterways that do injure fish and wildlife. We in Washington State, were presented an award for the amount of mercury and lead removed from our waterways from the Department of Fish and Game and the EPA. Removing any motorized equipment also eliminates anything but a pan and sluice for gold recovery. By rights, this should eliminate fishers from using motorized boats from your waters and people who mow their grass too close to the waterways.
