The purpose of this letter is to announce my strong support for SB 833 (Short Term Driver Licenses for Oregon residents).

I view SB 833 as clearly within the best interests of public safety based upon my many years of law enforcement experience. I have served 20 years in the state of Oregon as a police chief in both Astoria and Hillsboro police departments. I have been involved a total of 33 years as an active member of the law enforcement community.
