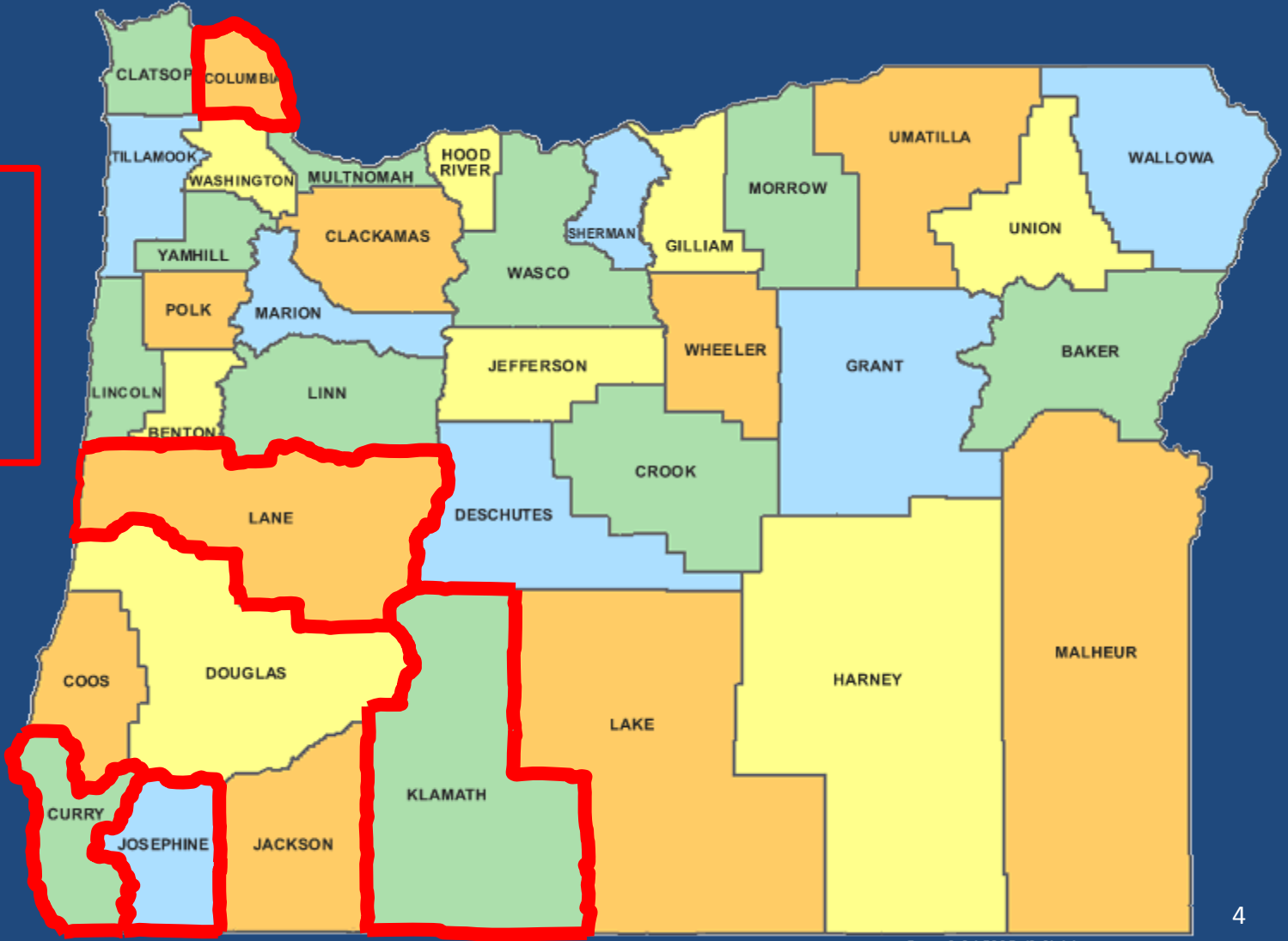
# Package 091 Reductions

- Improving Government Steering Team
  - Tasked by Governor Kitzhaber
  - Develop strategic approaches to deliver internal services more efficiently and effectively
- Package 091 is a total funds reduction
  - Includes all agency budgets as placeholder for efficiencies in Finance, IT, HR, Accounting, Payroll, and Procurement
- Enterprise Leadership Team will identify proposed efficiencies
- Agencies have not been asked to develop Package 091 implementation plans (until proposed efficiencies have been identified)

# Josephine County Sheriff's Staffing

- Current Staffing is thirty-nine (39) sworn personnel
- Twenty-two (22) sworn personnel in jail (21 required to keep open)
  - Ninety (90) jail beds
- Six (6) patrol deputies
  - Three (3) are contract Bureau Land Management, CJ, Marine Board)
- Three (3) road-patrol deputies
  - Eight (8) hour shifts
  - Monday – Friday (8 a.m. to 4 p.m.) or (9 a.m. to 5 p.m.)



# Josephine County Levy Impact

- Levy on May ballot

## If Levy Fails:

One (1) patrol deputy

Sixty (60) jail beds

## If Levy Passes:

Twelve (12) Deputies (12 hour days / 5 days a week)



# Curry County Sheriff's Staffing

- Current Staffing is thirty-eight (38) sworn personnel
- One (1) patrol lieutenant and four (4) deputies
  - Seven (7) days a week (7 a.m. to 10 p.m.)
- Ten (10) sworn personnel in jail
  - Fifty (50) jail beds



# Curry County Levy Impact

- Levy on May ballot

**If Levy Fails:**

Lose 2 deputies

**If Levy Passes:**

Status Quo





# Klamath County Sheriff's Staffing

- Current Staffing is thirteen (13) sworn personnel
- Three (3) patrol sergeants and eight (8) deputies
  - Seven (7) days a week (5 p.m. to 3 a.m.)
- Twenty-seven (27) sworn personnel in jail
  - One-hundred and sixteen (116) jail beds
- Budget Shortfall - \$1.48 million
  - County will fund \$1 million of shortfall
  - Jail beds will remain status quo
  - Patrol strength will be reduced to one (1) sergeant and three (3) deputies beginning July 1, 2013
  - Adjust coverage



# Lane County Sheriff's Staffing

- Current Staffing is one-hundred and forty-nine (149) sworn personnel
- Eighty-nine (89) sworn personnel in jail
  - Two-hundred and forty-nine (249) jail beds
- Five (5) patrol sergeants and fifteen (15) patrol deputies
  - Seven (7) days (9 a.m. to 5 p.m.) and (5 p.m. to 1 a.m.)
  - Twelve (12) are contract Bureau Land Management, Marine Board, City of Creswell, and City of Veneta)
- One (1) criminal sergeant and four (4) detectives



# Lane County Levy Impact

- Levy on May ballot

## If Levy Fails:

\$7.2 million short fall

Reduction in patrol hours. Only respond to serious violent crime (loss of road fund revenue would eliminate patrol function)

Closure of 131 jail beds

## If Levy Passes:

Status Quo



# Columbia County Sheriff's Staffing

- Current Staffing is twenty-eight (28) sworn personnel
- Twenty (20) sworn personnel in jail
  - One-hundred and fifteen (115) jail beds
- Four (4) patrol deputies
  - Monday – Thursday (6 a.m. to 2 a.m.)
  - Friday – Sunday (6 a.m. to 4 a.m.)
- Two (2) detectives



# Columbia County Budget Proposal

- No planned levy. Only a budget proposal

## If Budget Proposal does not pass:

Reduce number of jails beds from 115 to 60

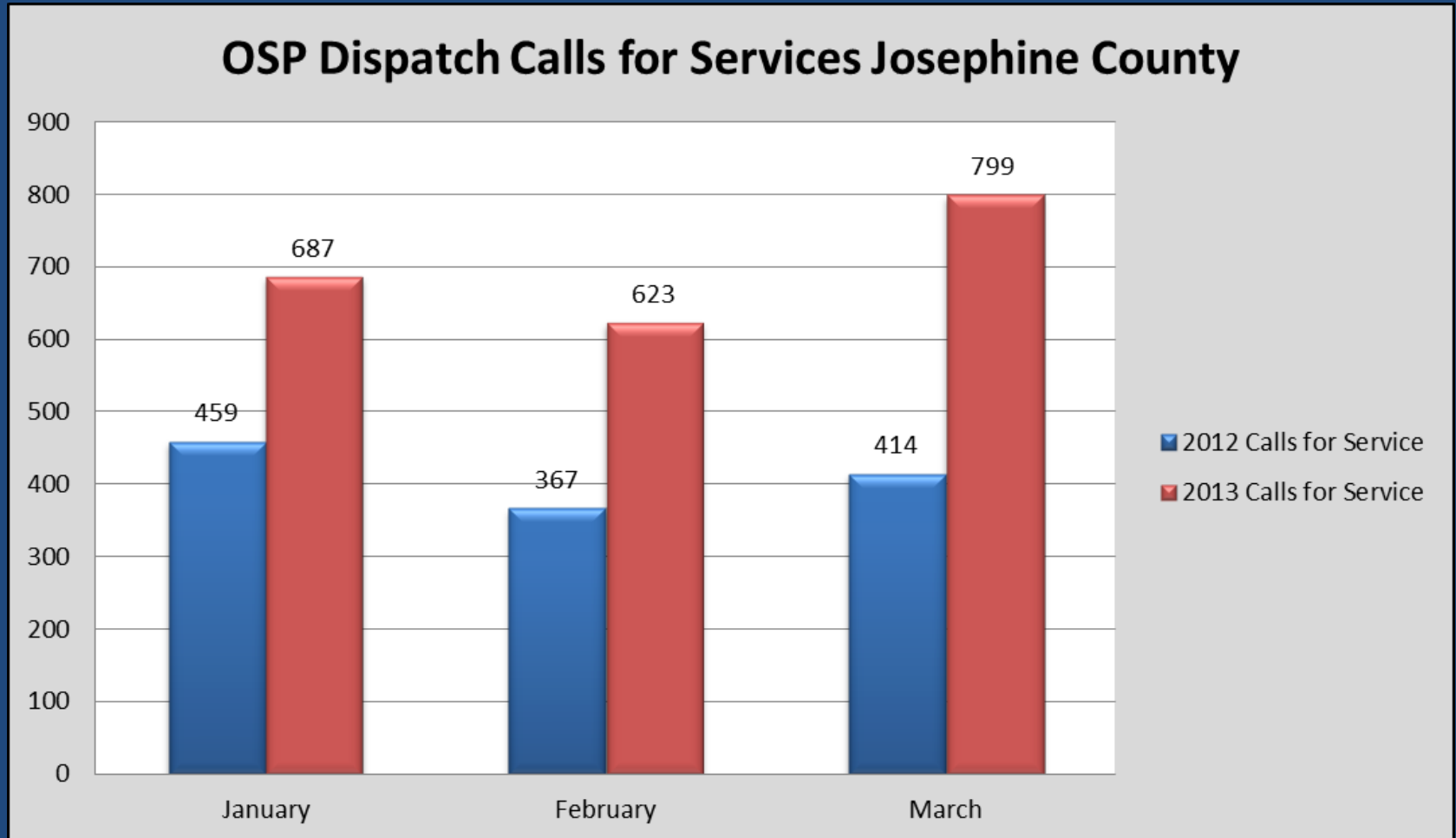
## If Budget Proposal is passed:

Eliminate 1 detective

Fiscal challenges remain to maintain staffing for jail, search and rescue, court security, and marine deputies

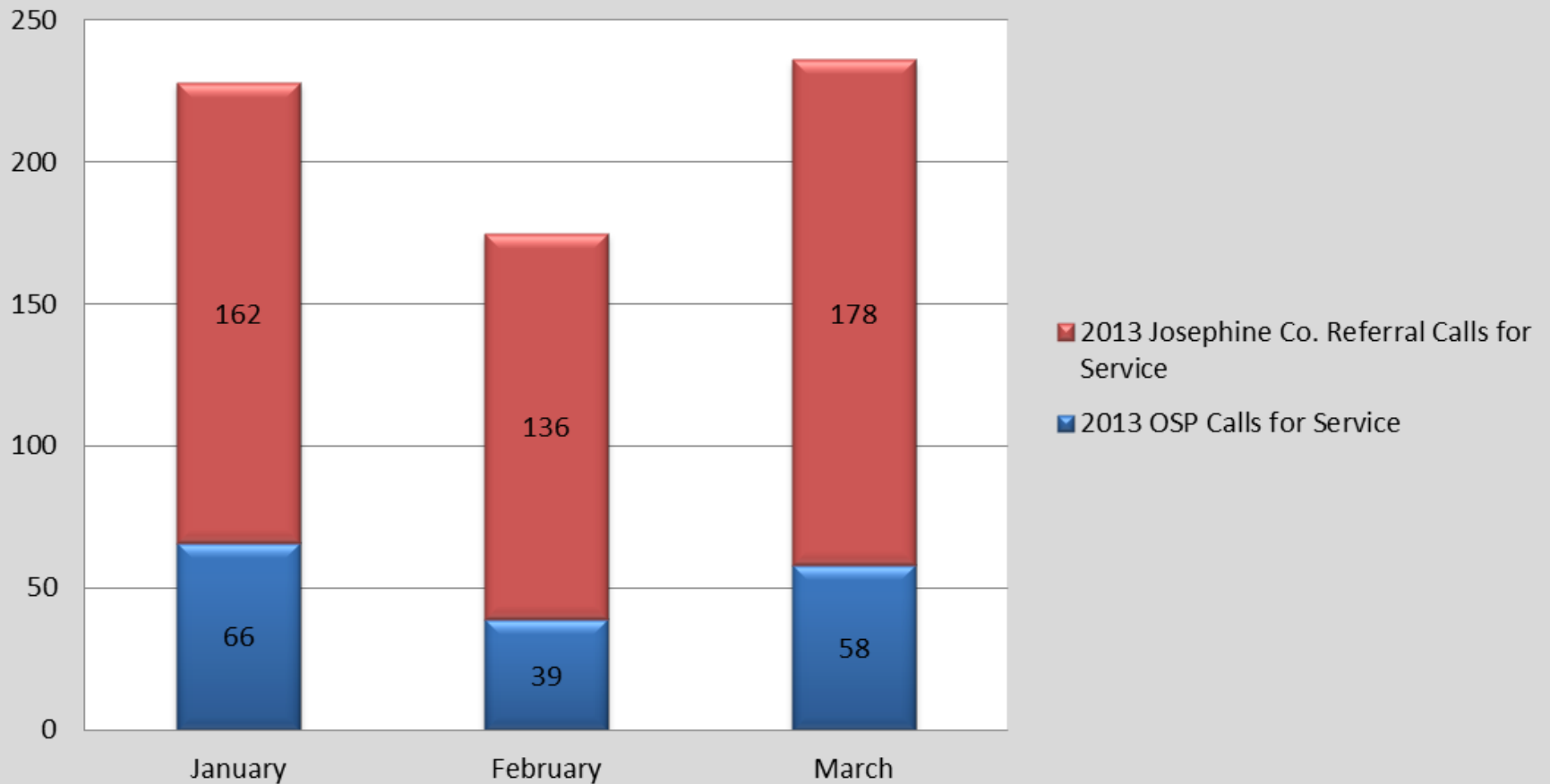

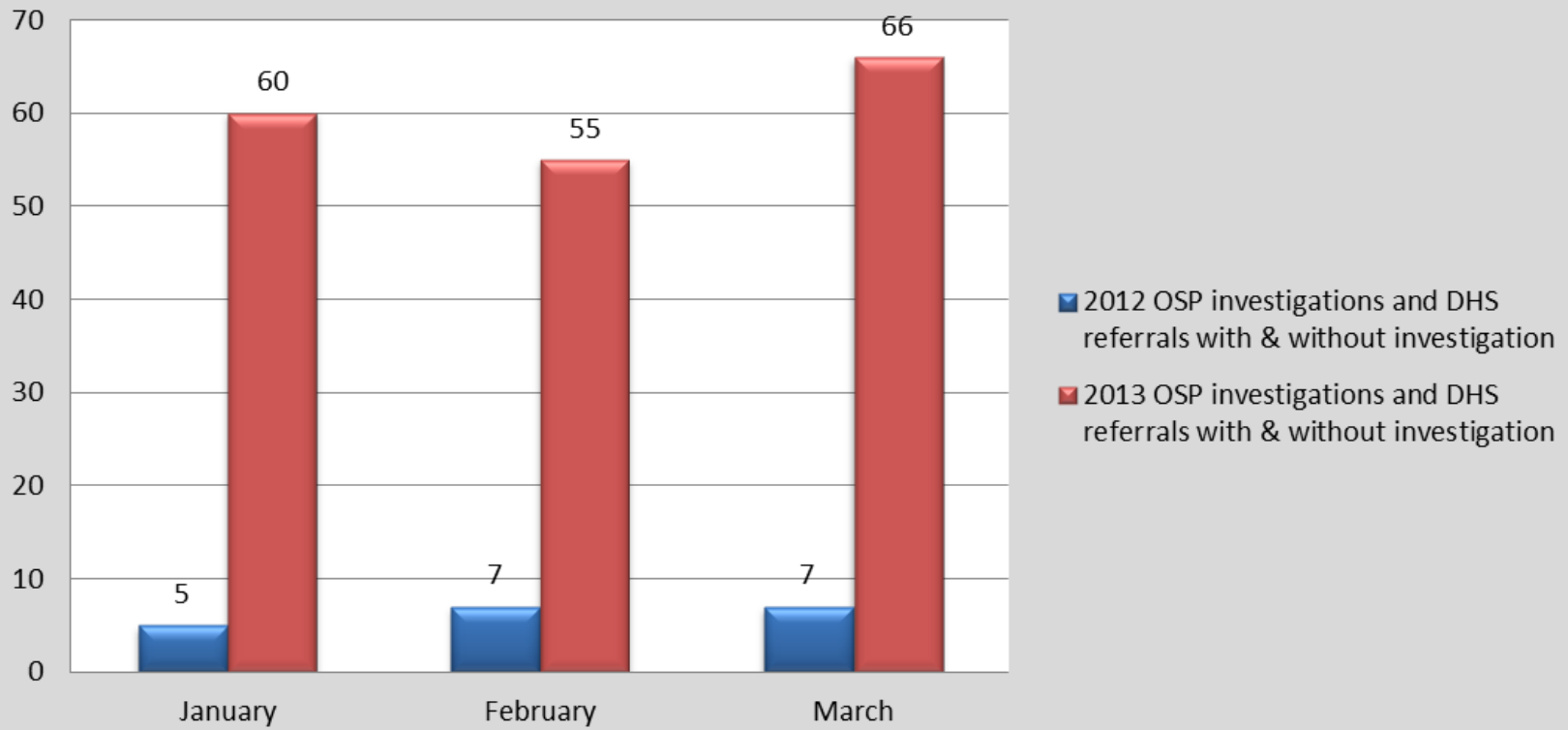

## OSP Patrol Division Calls for Service in Josephine Co.



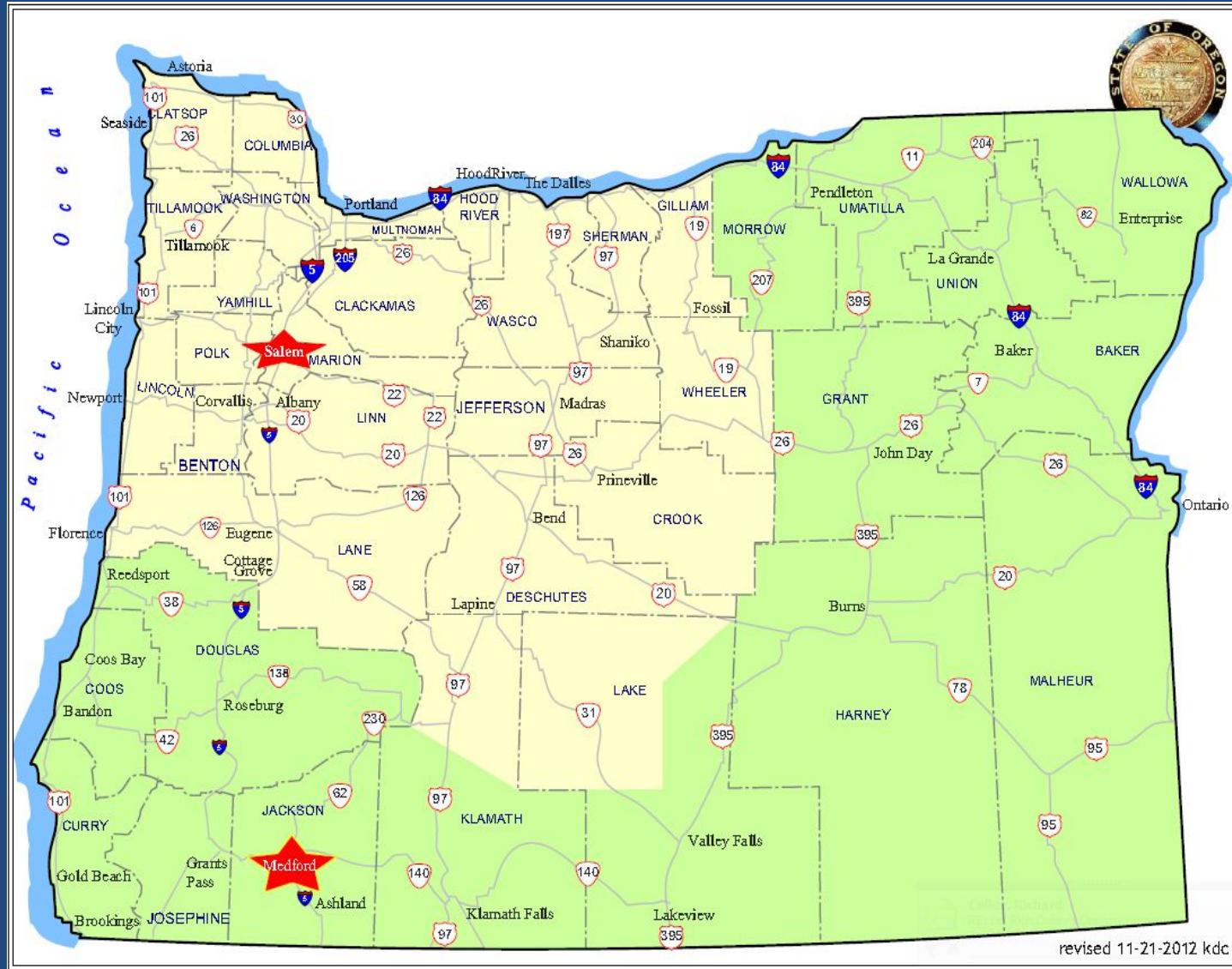

## OSP Criminal Division Investigations & Referrals in Josephine Co.





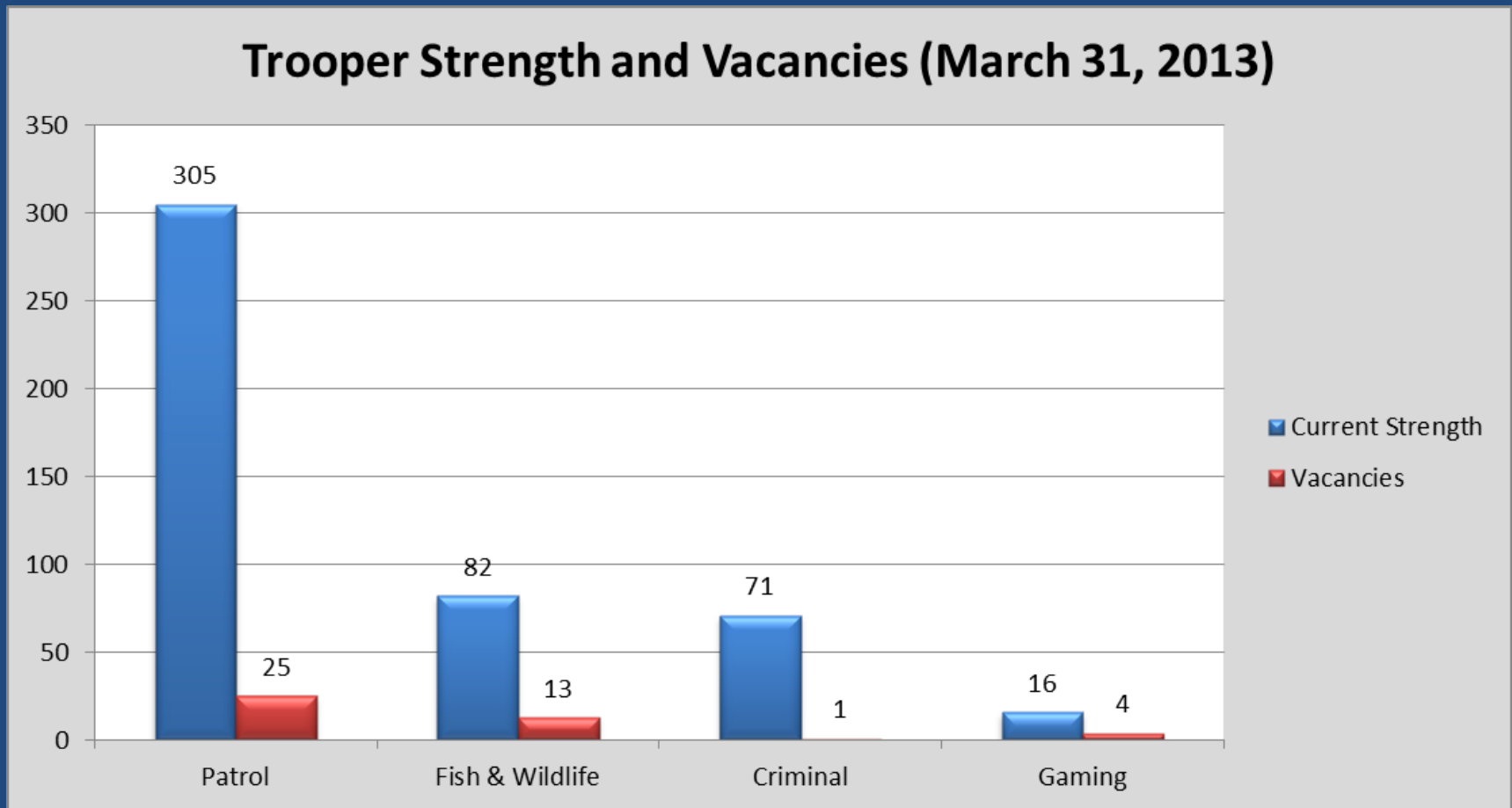

- Recruit Troopers in training = 22
- Background checks currently in field = 51
- Retirees used for background investigations = 19



# Future Hiring Plans

- Began accepting applications on Monday, April 22, 2013
- Goal of 1,000 applicants
- Entry-level testing on weekend of June 8, 2013
- Target DPSST Classes:
  - Basic #341 (January 6, 2014)
  - Basic #342 (January 27, 2014)
- 20% of applicants make it to background
  - 40% of these applicants are hired



# Retirement Trends

- Trend is 2 to 3 retirements per month
- Hired 33 Recruit Troopers in 2011-13 Biennium
- Large Recruit Trooper classes will be eligible to retire in 2013-15 Biennium
  - March 1987 = 70 Troopers
  - November 1988 = 50 Troopers
- PERS effect



# Project 200

- Legislature authorized 100 new Trooper positions in 2007-09 Biennium
- Hired 180 Recruit Troopers between July 2007 – January 2010
- Dedication and adequate resources



# Progress in Technology

- Communications backbone:
  - Records Management System (RMS)
  - Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD)
  - Mobile Data Terminals (MDTs)
- CAD configuration:
  - Began October 2010
  - Completed August 13, 2013
- RMS training:
  - Began January 22, 2013
  - Ends June 12, 2013
  - As of April 30, 2013, 352 out of 750 employees trained





# Progress in Technology

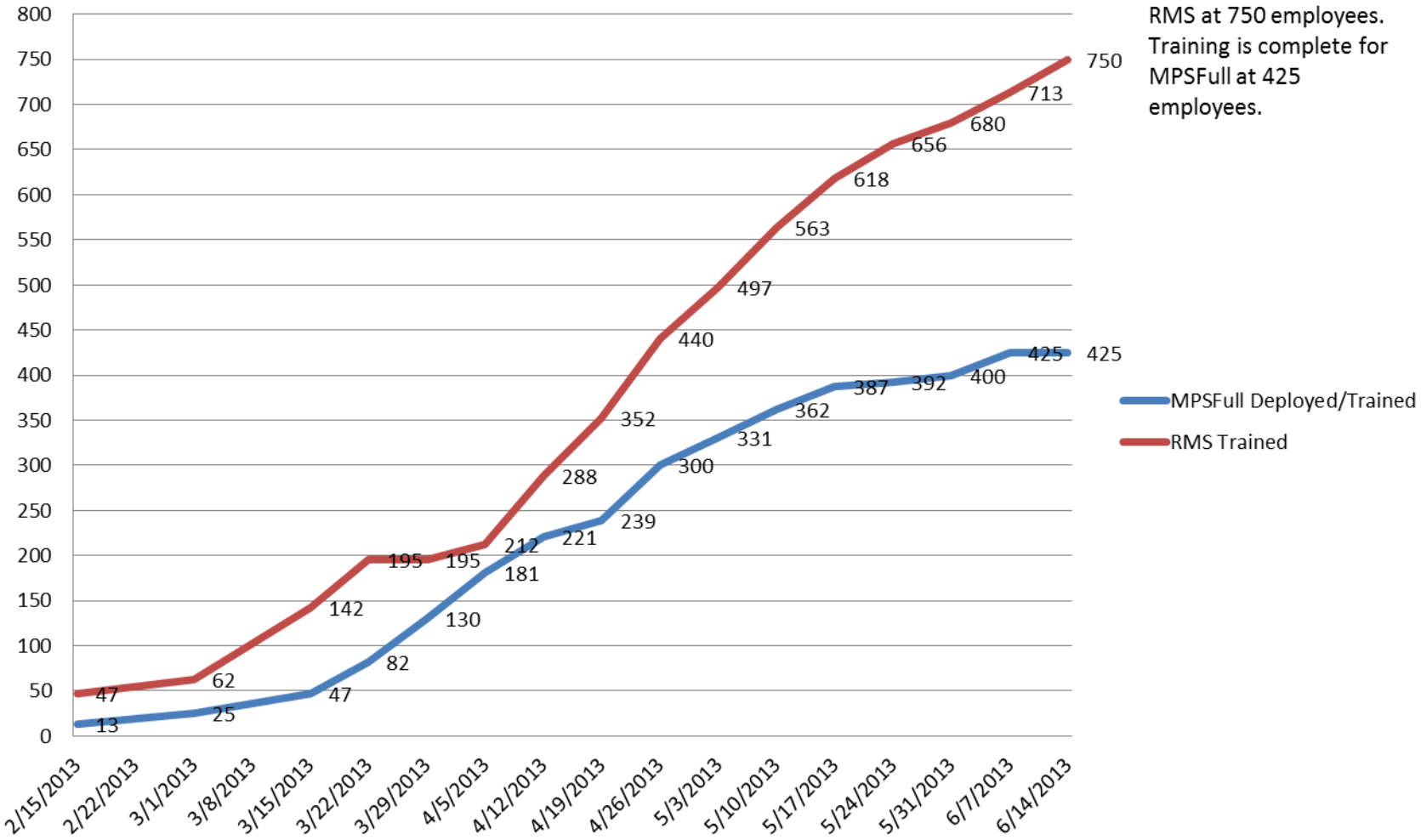
- MDTs / Mobile for Public Safety (MPS-Full) Training
  - Began on March 11, 2013
  - Ends June 14, 2013
  - As of April 30, 2013, 239 out of 425 employees trained
- Patrol Division will deploy 330 MDTs
  - Fifty-six (56) remaining (May 1, 2013)
  - Roll out will be completed by May 31, 2013
- Fish & Wildlife will deploy 95 MDTs
  - Twenty-two (22) remaining (May 1, 2013)
  - Will be completed by May 31, 2013

- Goal of 1-to-1 Trooper/vehicle ratio
- Troopers in communities with increased response times for call for service
- Two biennium approach

- Eighty-eight (88) additional for entire state coverage
  - Forty-four (44) in 2013-15 Biennium
  - Forty-four (44) in 2015-17 Biennium

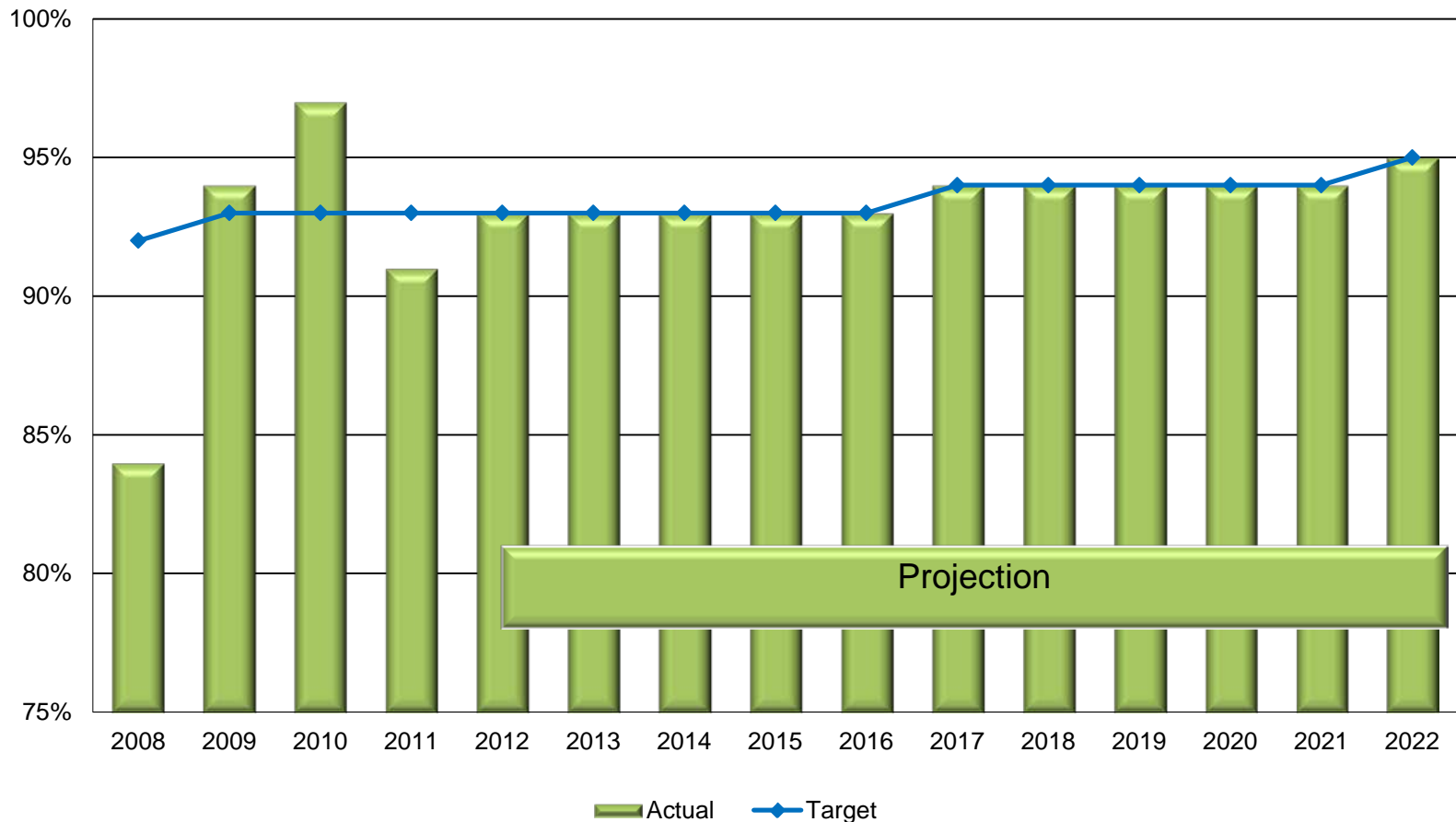

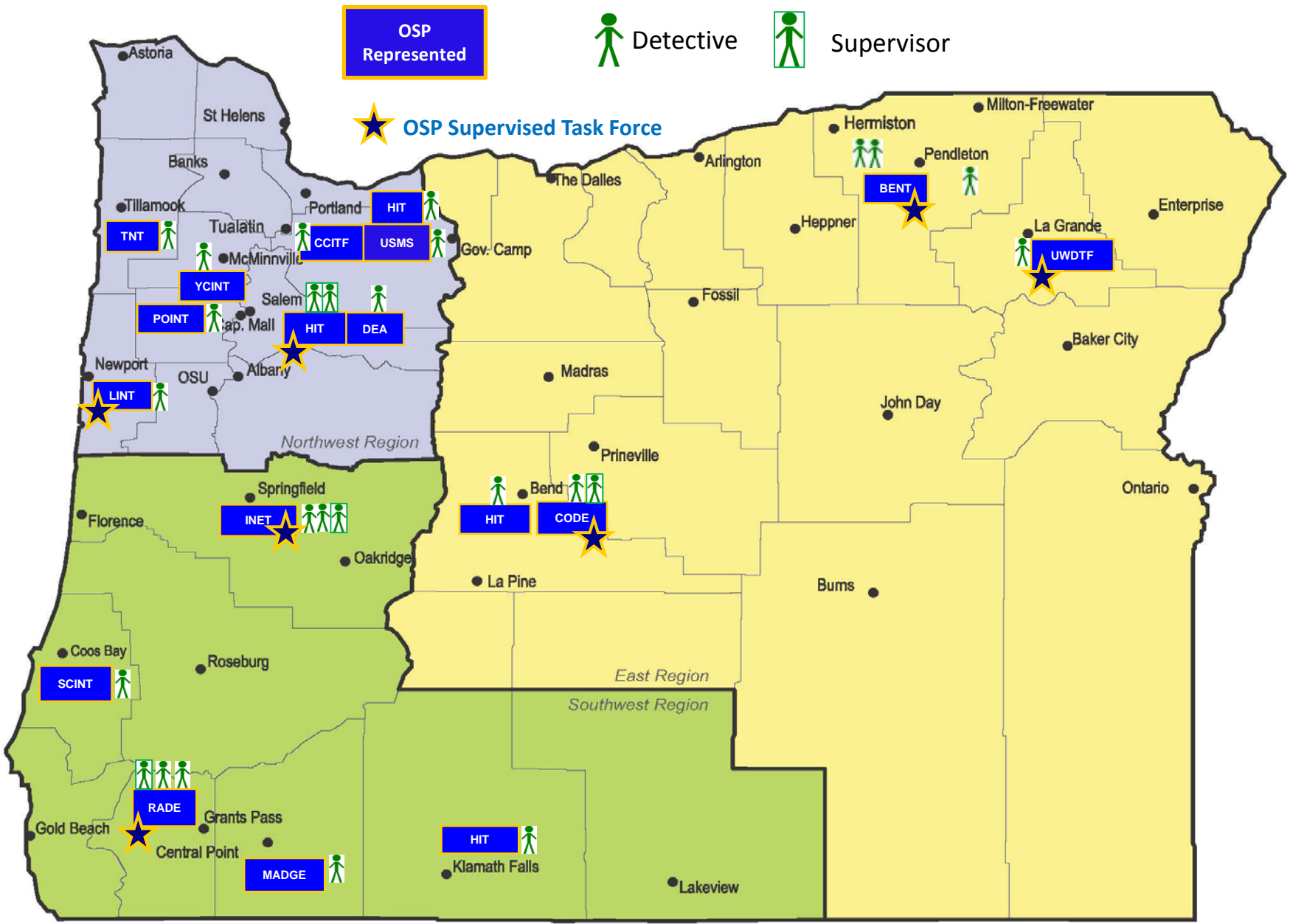

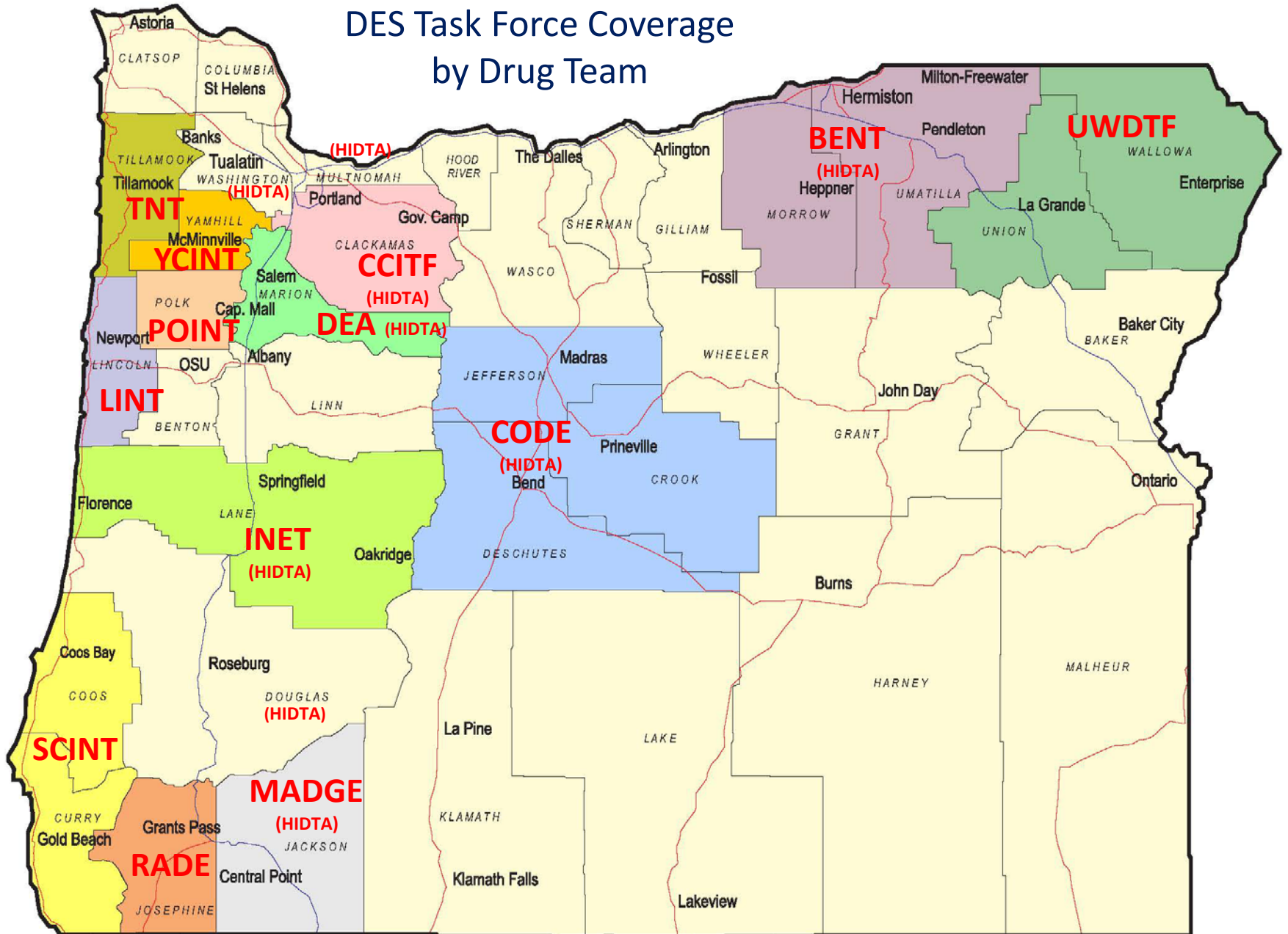

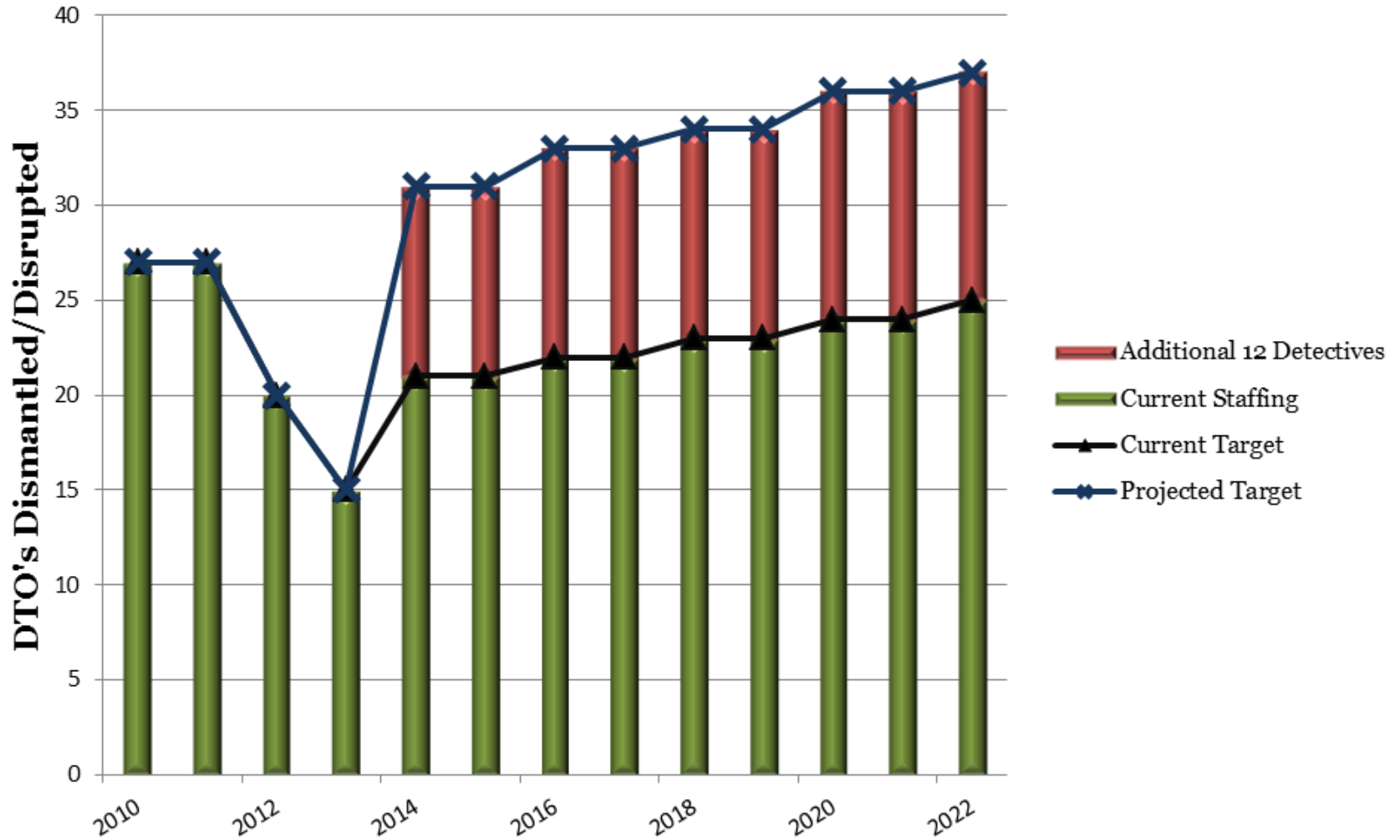


# Additional Drug Enforcement Section Resources

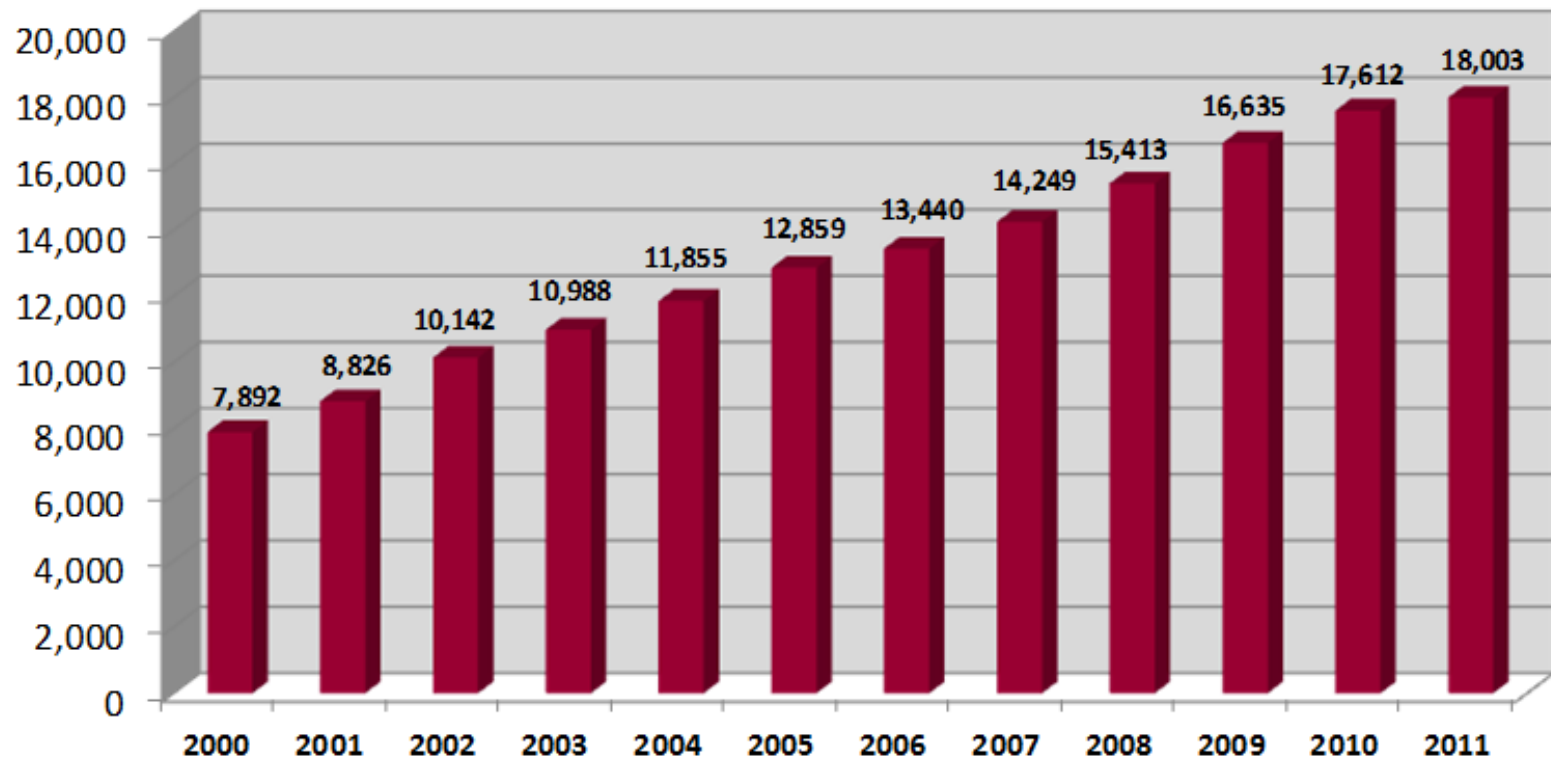
# Forensics Workload

# Effects of HB2549

- Board of Parole and Psychiatric Security Review Board (PSRB) would assess and place all registrants into risk levels by December 1, 2016
- Risk levels:
  - Level 1: Low risk to reoffend. May petition for relief 5 years after termination of supervision
  - Level 2: Moderate risk to reoffend. May petition for relief after 15 years after termination of supervision
  - Level 3: High risk to reoffend and persons with Rape 1, Sodomy 1, Unlawful Sex Penetration 1, Kidnap 1 or Burglary 1 with Intent. No relief available



# HB2549 Impact

- Short-term: Once offender granted relief, removal from registry will require additional work
- Long-term: Based on estimated growth and projected numbers for relief between 2014 to 2020, the SOR workload all balance out to equal hours and staffing requirements



# HB2549 – Estimated Savings?

- Short-term: Based on an 8 year project, no short-term savings are anticipated
- Long-term: Growth of registry shall halt in approximately 2021, with number of reductions beginning by approximately 2023
