OREGON IS OUT OF STEP WITH FEDERAL REGULATION... HB 3522 WILL BRING OREGON BACK IN LINE.







THE BACKGROUND:

HB 3522 removes the prohibition against electronic prescribing of schedule II controlled substances from the Oregon Controlled Substances Act. Federal law now allows the electronic prescribing of controlled substances, including C-II controlled substances, under certain circumstances. Over the past couple years the Board of Pharmacy has removed regulatory barriers to the electronic prescribing of controlled substances in Oregon. A small oversight, however, means that this one barrier remains in the statute. *The Legislature needs to remove this provision to be consistent with federal regulations.*

What are the Class 2 Drugs?

What are the Circumstances?
