<u>Package Description</u> This package adds one-time Other Funds expenditure limitation to accommodate 2013-15 agency activities performed under an \$180,000 Senior Medicare Patrol grant received in 2011-13. The grant is federally funded by the federal Older Americans Act but the funds are passed through the Department of Human Services so are budgeted as Other Funds.

LFO adjusted the package to reflect an updated estimate for the portion of the grant that will be spent in 2013-15 (an Other Funds expenditure limitation increase of \$14,618 from the previous estimate).

<u>Package Description</u> This package reflects the policy change in SB 822 that modifies the cost-of-living adjustment under the Public Employees Retirement System. This change reduces state employer contribution rates by approximately 2.2%.

An administrative action by the PERS Board, as directed by a budget note in the SB 822 budget report, will reduce state employer contribution rates by up to an additional 1.9%. However, no employer rate is reduced below its 2011-13 biennium rate.

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Long Term Care Ombudsman for biennial expenses. Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal Older Americans Act funds received from Department of Human Services, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by Long Term Care Ombudsman.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2013.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the financial administration of the Long Term Care Ombudsman; appropriating money;

3 limiting expenditures; and declaring an emergency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. There is appropriated to the Long Term Care Ombudsman, for the biennium

6 beginning July 1, 2013, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$1,977,698 for operations.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$665,965 \$680,583

8 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, as the maximum limit for payment of

9 expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, and in-

10 cluding federal Older Americans Act funds received from the Department of Human Services,

11 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in this section, collected or re-

12 ceived by the Long Term Care Ombudsman.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect
July 1, 2013.

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
