## **SUMMARY**

Establishes task force on uninsured motorist coverage and directs task force to examine scope of problem that motorists who do not carry required motor vehicle insurance present for other motorists and members of public and to recommend ways to ensure that all motorists have required insurance.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

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- 2 Relating to uninsured motorist coverage; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 4 SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Uninsured Motorist Coverage is
- 5 established, consisting of seven members appointed as follows:
- 6 (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint:
- 7 (A) Two members from among members of the Senate.
- 8 (B) One member who represents automobile insurance providers.
- 9 (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint:
- 10 (A) Two members from among members of the House of Represen-11 tatives.
- 12 (B) One member from the Department of State Police.
- 13 (c) The Director of the Department of Consumer and Business Ser-
- 14 vices shall appoint a member who represents the department's Insur-
- 15 ance Division.

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- 16 (2) The task force shall examine the scope of the problem that mo-
- 17 torists who do not carry required motor vehicle insurance present for
- 18 other motorists and members of the public and to recommend ways
- 19 to ensure that all motorists have the required insurance.

- 1 (3) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quo-2 rum for the transaction of business.
- 3 (4) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a ma-4 jority of the members of the task force.
- 5 (5) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chair-6 person.
- 7 (6) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority 8 shall make an appointment that is immediately effective.
- 9 (7) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the 10 call of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the 11 task force.
- 12 **(8)** The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.

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- (9) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to transportation as appropriate no later than October 1, 2014.
- 18 (10) The Department of Consumer and Business Services shall pro-19 vide staff support to the task force.
- (11) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legis-20 lative Assembly are not entitled to compensation, but may be reim-21bursed for actual and necessary travel and other expenses the 22 members incur in performing their official duties in the manner and 23 amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in 24 performing functions of the task force shall be paid out of funds ap-25 propriated to the Department of Consumer and Business Services for 26 purposes of the task force. 27
  - (12) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in performing its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force consider

2	SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of the
3	convening of the 2015 regular session of the Legislative Assembly as
4	specified in ORS 171.010.
5	SECTION 3. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate pres-
6	ervation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is de-
7	clared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect on its passage.
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
