Senate Bill 209A

Senate Bill 209A

Senate Bill (SB) 209A would allow the Board to enforce Final Orders when the respondent fails to pay civil penalties or fails to meet other terms of the Final Order. Establishes the Board's authority for instances when a Final Order has been duly issued, but the respondent fails to comply with the Board's terms.

Summary: The Bill also proposes the following housekeeping revisions:

- The language amending section 1 ensures there is no conflict with ORS 670.280 which applies to all licensed professions; Clarifies the Board's authority to consider the conviction of a felony as separate from the conviction of a misdemeanor.
- At the recommendation of Legislative Counsel, repeals ORS 672.205 (Disciplinary hearings; judicial review) as it is required under ORS Chapter 183 (Administrative Procedures Act).

Support and Opposition: OSBEELS has not received any input regarding this proposal. The Bill facilitates the Board's mission to protect health and safety of Oregonians.

Fiscal Impact: There should be no fiscal impact to this proposed legislation.
