### HB 3487

## Relating to vesting in the pension program of the Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan

House Bill 3487 allows any member of the Public Employees Retirement System killed in the line of duty to be considered vested under the pension program of Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan. The measure has an emergency clause and is effective on passage.

An amendment broadens the measure from just police officer and firefighter members to include any deceased member of OPSRP. An employer must certify to PERS that the member was killed in the course and scope of the member's employment. At the time of death, the member cannot be vested in OPSRP. The measure applies prospectively on or after the effective date of the measure.

The measure has a minimal fiscal impact based upon a PERS analysis of state fatalities who were yet-to-be vested in OPSRP.

The General Government Subcommittee recommends HB 3487 be amended and reported out do pass, as amended.

BACKGROUND: Under current law, a member of the Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan (OPSRP) becomes vested in the pension program when the member completes at least 600 hours of service in each of five calendar years or when an active member reaches the normal retirement age for the member. If a vested member dies before reaching

retirement age, the Public Employees Retirement System (PERS) Board must pay the death benefit to the spouse or any other person who is constitutionally required to be treated as a spouse. The death benefit will be for the life of the spouse and will be the actuarial equivalent of half of the pension that would otherwise have been paid to the deceased member.

## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 3487

1 Delete lines 6 through 15 of the printed bill and insert:

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Notwithstanding ORS 238A.115, a deceased member
 of the Public Employees Retirement System shall be considered vested
 for all purposes under the pension program if:

5 "(1) At the time of death the member was an active member of the 6 system;

"(2) The employer of the member certifies to the Public Employees
Retirement Board that the member was killed in the course and scope
of the member's employment; and

"(3) At the time of death the member was not otherwise vested in
 the pension program under ORS 238A.115.

"SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2013 Act applies only to a member
 of the Public Employees Retirement System who is killed in the course
 and scope of the member's employment on or after the effective date
 of this 2013 Act.".

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
