Oregon Board of Pharmacy

HB 5037 is the fee ratification bill for the Oregon Board of Pharmacy.

SB 1565 passed during the prior legislative session allows for the dispensing of prescription drugs by a physician assistant under the supervision of a physician or supervising physician organization. The measure required the supervising physician or organization to register and be licensed by the Board of Pharmacy as a dispensing drug outlet.

During the interim following the 2012 Legislative Session, the Board of Pharmacy adopted rules and set a fee of \$300 after seeking approval from the Department of Administrative Services. HB 5037 provides legislative approval for the fee set by rule. The Board of Pharmacy anticipates that the revenue generated by the fee will total roughly \$12,000 in the 2013-2015 biennium.

The Education Subcommittee recommends HB 5037 be reported out do pass.

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: The measure is the fee ratification bill for the fee established by the Board of Pharmacy and approved by the Department of Administrative Services during the interim following the 2012 legislative session for supervising physician dispensing outlets as required by Chapter 34, Oregon Laws 2012 (SB 1565)

BACKGROUND: SB 1565 (Ch. 34, Oregon Laws 2012) allows for the dispensing of prescription drugs by a physician assistant under the supervision of a physician or supervising physician organization. The measure required the supervising physician or organization to register and be licensed by the Board of Pharmacy as a dispensing drug outlet.

During the interim following the 2012 legislative session, the Board of Pharmacy adopted rules and set a fee of \$300 after seeking approval from the Department of Administrative Services. The Board of Pharmacy reports that they had constituency representation during the rulemaking process related to the fee and constituency support of the fee amount.
