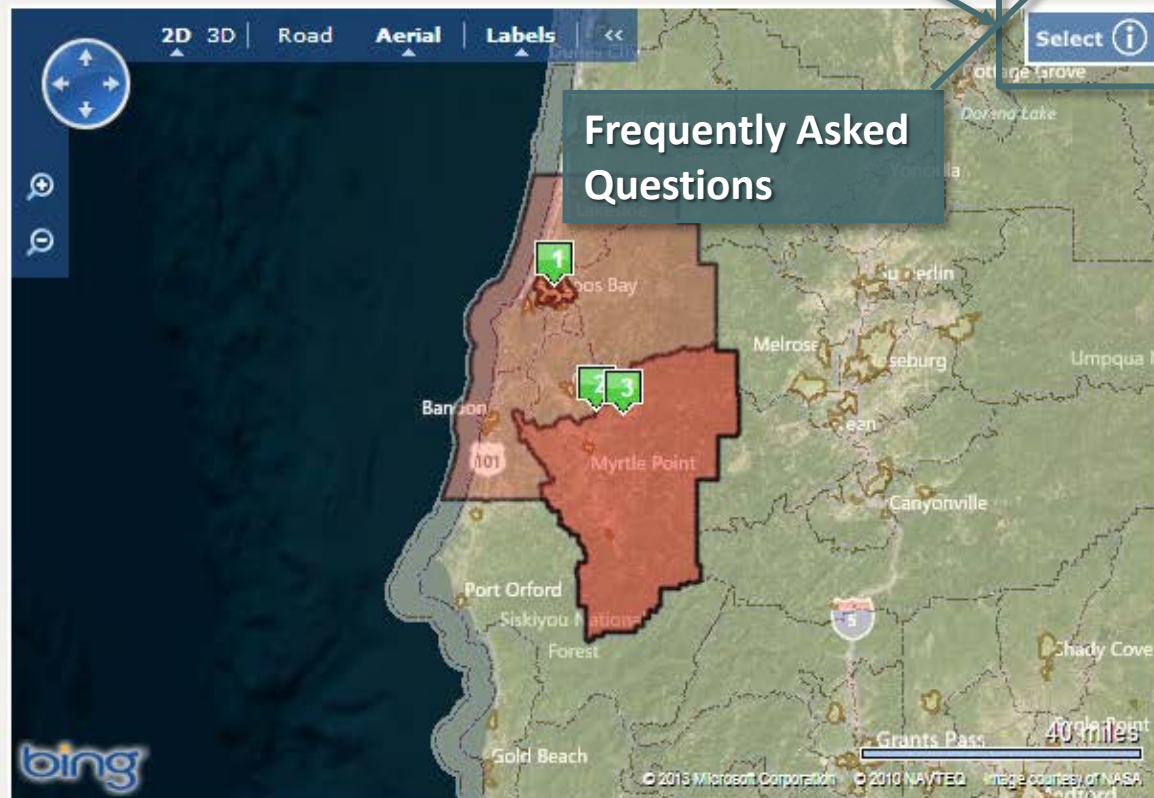
Step 2: Compare or Combine

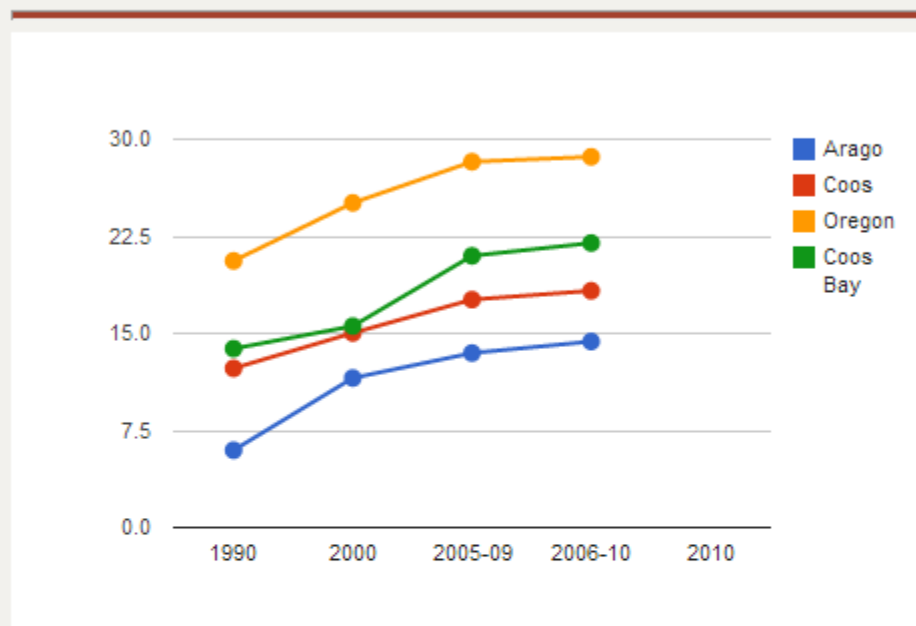

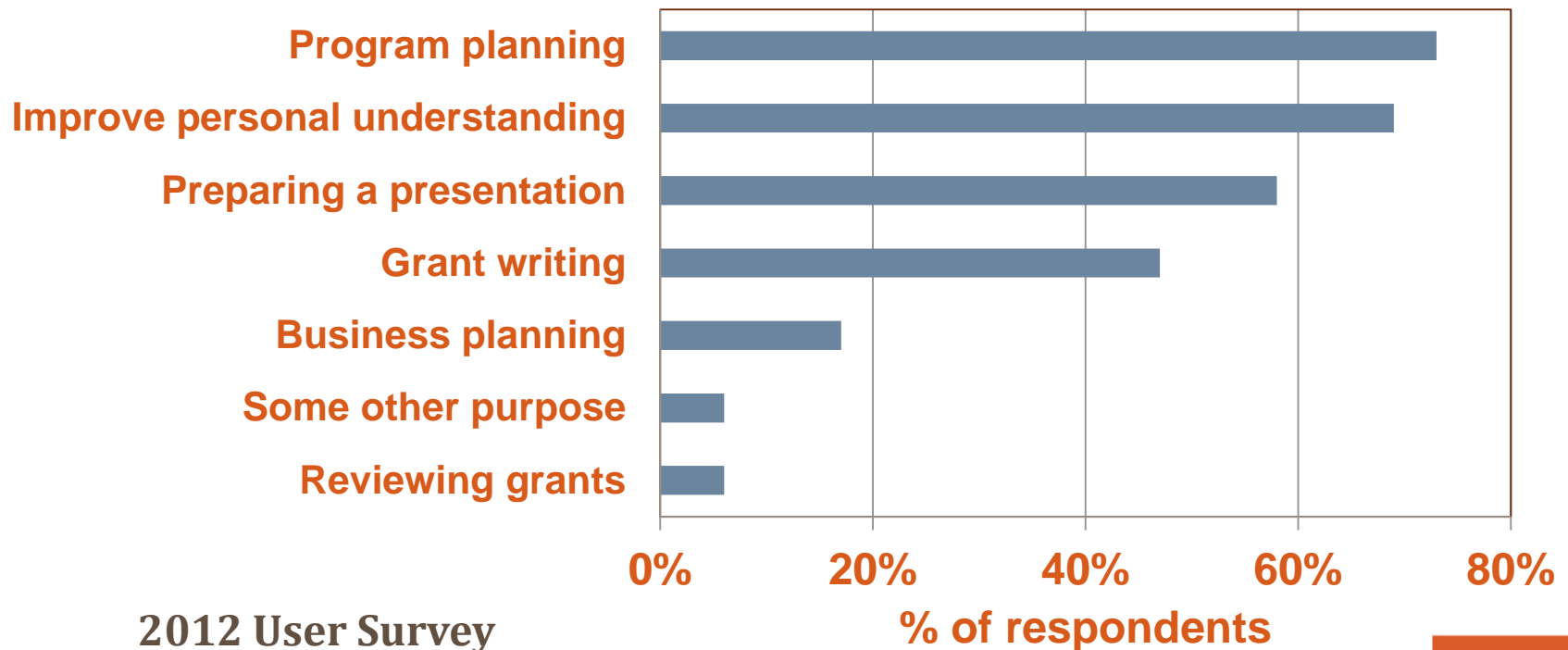

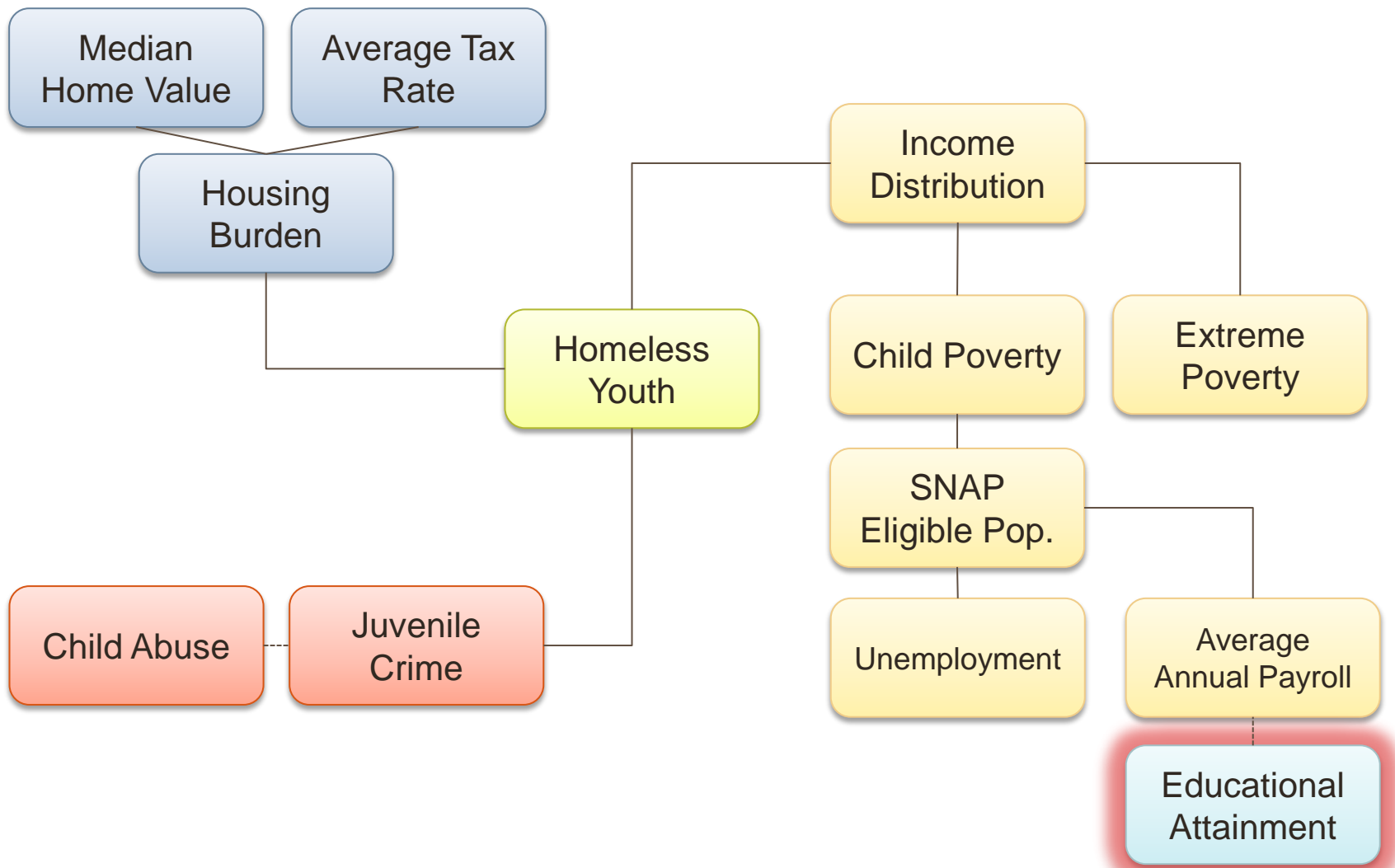


Data story example: Homeless Youth

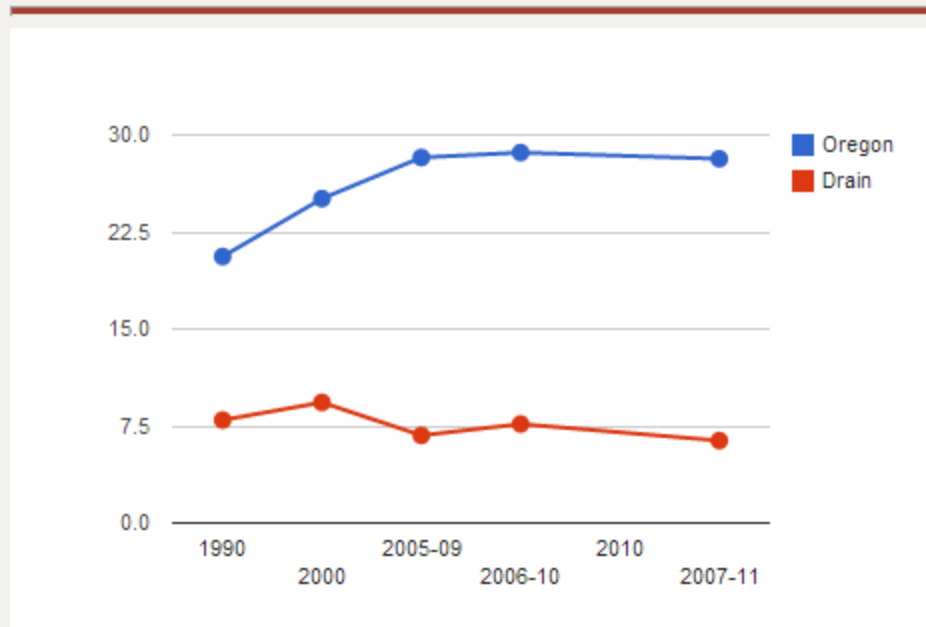
Up-stream causes:

- Child abuse – may explain teen homelessness
- Unemployment
- Housing affordability
- Educational attainment (adult)
- Crime (juvenile and adult)

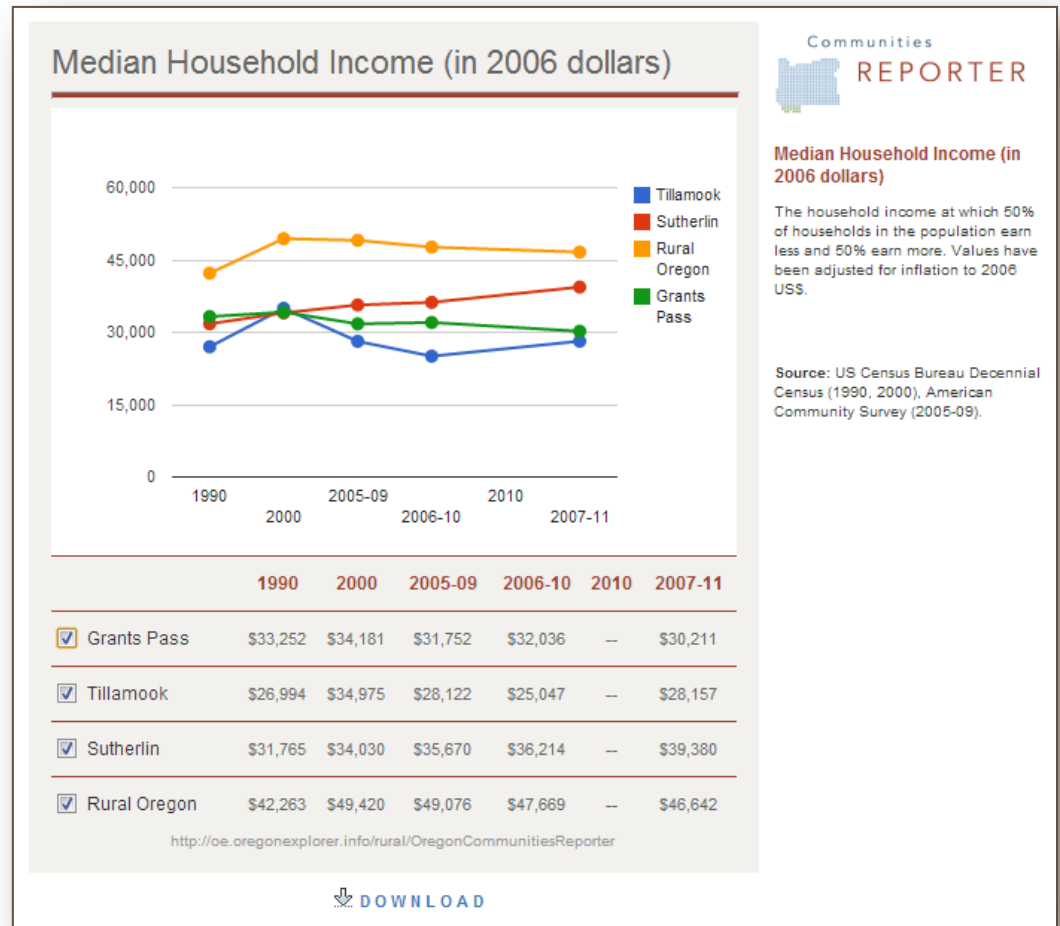
Percentage of Adults with 4-year Degree or Greater
