Measure Description:

Authorizes adoption of fees for certain activities related to career schools.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Department of Education, Higher Education Coordinating Commission, Oregon Student Assistance Commission (OSAC)

Summary of Expenditure Impact:

Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis: This bill adjusts fees for instate and out-of-state private career schools. Fees have not been increased in 14 years. The fee is based on the amount of tuition income generated. The bill authorizes the fee increases until July 1, 2015. After that date, the Higher Education Coordinating Commission is granted the authority to set fees. This ability currently resides with the Superintendent of Public Instruction. The proposed fee adjustments are anticipated to generate an additional \$150,000 in Other Funds revenue.

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Authorizes the State Board of Education to collect nonrefundable licensing fees for administration of licensing program for career schools. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2013.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

• Legislative role in establishing fees

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: According to the Department of Education (ODE), the licensing fees for Oregon's private career schools have not been raised in 14 years. Currently, the regulation of career schools is funded through fees alone and is not eligible for general fund dollars. Recent investigations into private career schools have been conducted at considerable cost, necessitating increases in the investigative fee to cover these costs. House Bill 2185 raises the fee schedule to support the program, and allows the State Board of Education to determine future fee changes by rule.
