Subject: HB 3459-A – Office of Small Business Assistance Work Session Recommendations

HB 3459-A establishes the Office of Small Business Administration within the Office of Secretary of State for purpose of facilitating interactions between small businesses and state agencies. The bill also establishes complaint and investigation procedures.

The measure, the original staff measure summary, and previously-released fiscal impact statement are available on the Oregon Legislative Information System (OLIS) and are attached to the memorandum.

The General Government Subcommittee held a public hearing on SB 143, a measure with essentially the same provisions as HB 3549-A, on 4/24/13.

The measure has a \$248,162 fiscal impact, and requires establishment of two full-time positions (1.50 FTE). Program costs are financed with Corporation Division fees that would otherwise be available for transfer to the General Fund. The agency requested support for funding and for the positions in Policy Option Package 151.

<u>Amendment</u>

The Legislative Fiscal Office recommends adoption of the HB 3459-A2 amendments. These amendments add the establishment of a \$248,162 Other Funds expenditure limitation to the Secretary of State's 2013-15 biennium budget. The amendments, therefore, provide the adjustment required to the Secretary of State's budget to establish the Office of Small Business Administration. If the amendments are approved, the budget report prepared for the bill will include the establishment of the two requested positions (1.50 FTE).

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Establishes Office of Small Business Assistance in Office of Secretary of State for purpose of facilitating interactions between small businesses and state agencies with regulatory authority over small businesses. Establishes complaint and investigation procedures. Requires preparation of reports for distribution to Secretary of State upon conclusion of investigations of complaints. Continuously appropriates moneys to Office of Secretary of State to fund functions of Office of

Small Business Assistance.

(2) The net amount accruing to the Secretary of State from all fees, charges, interest, fines,
penalties and miscellaneous revenues from all sources relating to business registry functions, and
moneys received by the Secretary of State under ORS chapters 79 and 194 and ORS 80.100 to 80.130,
87.246, 87.767 and 87.806 to 87.831 shall, after deduction of refunds, be paid over to the State
Treasurer and deposited at least monthly in the Operating Account.

(3) Moneys deposited to the credit of the Operating Account are continuously appropriated to

An amount equal to \$20 for each of those filings shall be deposited by the Secretary of State in the Operating Account. The Secretary of State shall then deposit all other moneys from the fees collected during the month under ORS 56.140 (1) to (4) in the General Fund. Amounts deposited to the General Fund under this subsection are available for general governmental expenses.

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Establishes Office of Small Business Administration within the Office of Secretary of State for purpose of facilitating interactions between small businesses and state agencies. Establishes complaint and investigation procedures. Continuously appropriates moneys to Office of Secretary of State to fund functions of Office of Small Business Assistance.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Giving a voice to small businesses
- Small business as source of economic growth and innovation
- Complex and confusing state regulations
- Limitations of Bureau of Labor and Industries in providing technical assistance

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Prohibits Office of Small Business Assistance from reviewing and investigating a complaint that is the subject of an agency action that could result in a contested case proceeding under the Oregon Administrative Procedures Act.

BACKGROUND: The Secretary of State is a statewide elected official responsible for, among other duties, registering businesses operating in Oregon and conducting audits. In addition, the Office of the Secretary of State conducts special investigations regarding potential misuse of state resources. Its investigations may occur at state agencies, or may involve local governments or contractors receiving state or federal funds from state agencies. Citizens, businesses, and government employees may report government waste, fraud, or abuse to the Audits Division by phone, internet, or mail.

House Bill 3459-A creates the Office of Small Business Assistance within the Office of the Secretary of State with two primary functions: facilitate interactions between small businesses and state agencies, and conduct reviews and investigations of complaints received from small businesses with respect to interactions with state agencies. The measure defines a small business as a prospective, new or established business with 100 or fewer employees that is or will be located in Oregon. The measure also prohibits subjecting a person who makes a complaint or participates in an investigation to penalty, sanction, or restriction.

Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis:

The measure establishes the Office of Small Business Assistance (OSBA) within the Office of the Secretary of State (SOS) for the purpose of facilitating communication and resolving issues and complaints related to interactions between small businesses (as defined in the bill) and executive branch state agencies. The measure also contains a provision allowing the OSBA to investigate otherwise unresolvable issues and complaints between state agencies and small businesses, in certain circumstances, allowing for agency comment on final determination.

The Secretary of State estimates that to carry out the provisions of the bill it would require the establishment of two full-time positions (1.50 FTE in 2013-15 biennium). The positions would be funded with Corporate Division fees collected by the SOS that would otherwise be available for transfer to the General Fund.

The establishment of the positions and the funding is included as a policy option package in the Governor's recommended budget.
