Senate Bill 739 would require the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) to consult with specified entities when developing academic content standards for Oregon Studies.

Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis: This bill would require the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) to consult with specified entities when developing academic content standards for Oregon Studies.

Currently, ODE does not typically create and disseminate instructional materials and the provisions of this bill would require ODE to do so. ODE would need to develop academic standards, with respect to Oregon Studies, for economics, history, civics and government and geography. In addition, the materials developed would need to be adapted for grades K-12. ODE is also directed to consult with the Advocacy Commissions Office. The bulk of the effort would be the development of academic standards and materials.

The Advocacy Commissions Office does not anticipate a fiscal impact due to the requirements of this bill.

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 739**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “provisions;” delete the rest
2 of the line and insert “amending ORS 329.492; appropriating money; and de-
3 claring an emergency.”.

4 On page 2, after line 2, insert:

5 **“SECTION 3. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
6 ation, there is appropriated to the Department of Education, for the
7 biennium beginning July 1, 2013, out of the General Fund, the amount
8 of \$146,167, which may be expended for the purpose of complying with
9 the provisions of this 2013 Act.**

10 **“SECTION 4. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate
11 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
12 declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect July 1, 2013.”.**
