

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO RESOLVE CONFLICTS TO  
A-ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL 2370**

1 On page 4 of the printed A-engrossed bill, after line 31, insert:

2 **“SECTION 3. If House Bill 3400 becomes law, section 1 of this 2013**  
3 **Act (amending ORS 184.483) is repealed and ORS 184.483, as amended**  
4 **by section 1, chapter \_\_, Oregon Laws 2013 (Enrolled House Bill 3400),**  
5 **is amended to read:**

6 “184.483. (1) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall de-  
7 velop and make available an Oregon transparency website. The website shall  
8 allow any person to view information that is a public record and not exempt  
9 from disclosure under ORS 192.410 to 192.505, including but not limited to  
10 information described in subsection (3) of this section.

11 “(2) State agencies and education service districts, to the extent practi-  
12 cable and subject to laws relating to confidentiality, when at no additional  
13 cost, using existing data and existing resources of the state agency or edu-  
14 cation service district and without reallocation of resources, shall:

15 “(a) Furnish information to the Oregon transparency website by posting  
16 reports and providing links to existing information system applications in  
17 accordance with standards established by the Oregon Department of Admin-  
18 istrative Services; and

19 “(b) Provide the information in the format and manner required by the  
20 Oregon Department of Administrative Services.

21 “(3) To the extent practicable and subject to laws relating to  
22 confidentiality, when at no additional cost, using existing data and existing

1 resources of the state agency or education service district and without real-  
2 location of resources, the Oregon transparency website shall contain infor-  
3 mation about each state agency and education service district, including but  
4 not limited to:

5 “(a) Annual revenues of state agencies and education service districts;

6 “(b) Annual expenditures of state agencies and education service districts;

7 “(c) Annual human resources expenses, including compensation, of state  
8 agencies and education service districts;

9 “(d) Annual tax expenditures of state agencies, including, when possible,  
10 the identity of the recipients of each tax expenditure;

11 “(e) [*Contracting and subcontracting information of state agencies and ed-*  
12 *ucation service districts, to the extent allowed by law, including,*] For each  
13 state agency, a description of the percentage of expenditures made in this  
14 state and the percentage of expenditures made outside this state under all  
15 contracts for goods or services entered into by the state agency during each  
16 biennium;

17 “(f) A prominently placed graphic representation of the primary funding  
18 categories and approximate number of individuals served by the state agency  
19 or the education service district;

20 “(g) A description of the mission, function and program categories of the  
21 state agency or education service district;

22 “(h) Information about the state agency from the Oregon Progress Board;

23 “(i) A copy of any audit report issued by the Secretary of State for the  
24 state agency or of any audit reports issued for the education service district;

25 “(j) The local service plans of the education service districts;

26 “(k) A copy of each report required by statute for education service dis-  
27 tricts; and

28 “(L) A copy of all notices of public meetings of the education service  
29 districts.

30 “(4) In addition to the information described in subsection (3) of this

1 section[, *each state agency shall post on the Oregon transparency website no-*  
2 *tices of public meetings required to be provided by the state agency under ORS*  
3 *192.640.】:*

4 **“(a) The department shall post on the Oregon transparency website**  
5 **notices of public meetings required to be provided by the state agency**  
6 **under ORS 192.640. If the state agency maintains a website where**  
7 **minutes or summaries of the public meetings are available, the state**  
8 **agency shall provide the department with the link to that website for**  
9 **posting on the Oregon transparency website.**

10 **“(b) The department shall post on the Oregon transparency website**  
11 **a link for the website maintained by the Secretary of State for rules**  
12 **adopted by the state agency. If the state agency maintains a website**  
13 **where the rules of the agency are posted, or where any information**  
14 **relating to the rules of the agency is posted, the state agency shall**  
15 **provide the department with the link to that website for posting on**  
16 **the Oregon transparency website.**

17 **“(c) The department shall provide links on the Oregon transparency**  
18 **website for information received by the department regarding con-**  
19 **tracts and subcontracts entered into by a state agency or education**  
20 **service district, to the extent disclosure of that information is allowed**  
21 **by law and the information is already available on websites maintained**  
22 **by the state agency or education service district. To the extent avail-**  
23 **able, the information linked to under this section must include:**

24 **“(A) Information on professional, personal and material contracts;**

25 **“(B) The date of each contract and the amount payable under the**  
26 **contract;**

27 **“(C) The period during which the contract is or was in effect; and**

28 **“(D) The names and addresses of vendors.**

29 **“(5) In creating, operating, refining and recommending enhancements to**  
30 **the Oregon transparency website, the Oregon Department of Administrative**

1 Services and the Transparency Oregon Advisory Commission created in ORS  
2 184.486 shall consider and, to the extent practicable, adhere to the following  
3 principles:

4 “(a) The website must be accessible without cost and be easy to use;

5 “(b) Information included on the Oregon transparency website must be  
6 presented using plain, easily understandable language; and

7 “(c) The website should teach users about how state government and ed-  
8 ucation service districts work and provide users with the opportunity to  
9 learn something about how state government and education service districts  
10 raise and spend revenue.

11 “(6) If a state agency or an education service district is not able to in-  
12 clude information described in this section on the Oregon transparency  
13 website because of the lack of availability of information or cost in acquiring  
14 it, the Transparency Oregon Advisory Commission created in ORS 184.486  
15 shall list the information that is not included for that state agency or edu-  
16 cation service district in the commission’s report to the Legislative Assembly  
17 required under ORS 184.486.

18 **“(7) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall in-**  
19 **clude on the Oregon transparency website a page that provides links**  
20 **to websites established by local governments, as defined in ORS**  
21 **174.116, and by special government bodies, as defined in ORS 174.117,**  
22 **for the purpose of providing transparency in the revenues, expendi-**  
23 **tures and budgets of the public bodies. The department shall include**  
24 **a link to the website of the public body upon receiving a request from**  
25 **the public body, and shall consider recommendations from the Trans-**  
26 **parency Oregon Advisory Commission for the inclusion of other links**  
27 **to local and special government body websites. The department shall**  
28 **include a prominent link on the home page of the Oregon transparency**  
29 **website for information posted to the page described in this**  
30 **subsection.”.**
