

SB 540

Relating to Public Education Facilities

SB 540 creates the twelve-member Task Force on School Capital Improvement Planning charged with recommending to the Oregon Education Investment Board programs and funding sources that will allow providers of public education to respond to evolving methods for delivering education and for funding and maintaining capital infrastructures. The Task Force also is to recommend ways to establish a more efficient and integrated capital infrastructure system school through 12th grade.

The bill also requires the Department of Education to establish and maintain a public education facility information database. The information in the database would include: data on school facilities including size, age, district indebtedness, maintenance and energy costs, and details on major renovations. A waiver for districts that cannot provide this data without additional resources is provided for.

The bill appropriates \$325,000 out of the General Fund for developing and maintaining the database. Another \$100,000 is appropriated for the Task Force.

The Education Subcommittee recommends SB 540 be amended, and reported out do pass, as amended.

Summary of Revenue Changes

The funding for the Task Force on School Capital Improvement Planning and the education facility information database is entirely General Fund.

Summary of Education Subcommittee Action

Senate Bill 540 creates a twelve-member Task Force on School Capital Improvement Planning charged with recommending to the Oregon Education Investment Board programs and funding sources that:

- Will allow providers of public education to respond to evolving methods for delivering education and for funding and maintaining capital infrastructures.
- Establish a more efficient and integrated capital infrastructure system for preschool through 12th grade.

A report by the Task Force is due to the Legislature by October 1, 2014. The Task Force sunsets on the convening of the 2015 Legislative session. The Department of Education is to provide support to the Task Force. \$100,000 General Fund is appropriated for the work of the Task Force.

This bill also requires the Department of Education to establish and maintain a public education facility information database to provide information on facilities serving preschool through grade 12 and any related auxiliary buildings and properties. The Department is permitted to require schools to provide relevant data. However, school districts and education service districts are allowed to request a waiver if this information cannot be culled without additional resources. The database must be available to the public. The bill appropriates \$325,000 General Fund for developing (\$100,000) and maintaining (\$225,000) the database. The Department anticipates establishing two part-time limited duration positions (1.67 FTE) to carry out the provisions of the bill.

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
A-ENGROSSED SENATE BILL 540**

1 On page 1 of the printed A-engrossed bill, delete lines 15 through 23 and
2 insert:

3 “(4)(a) The task force shall research and recommend to the Oregon Edu-
4 cation Investment Board:

5 “(A) Programs and funding sources that:

6 “(i) Allow providers of public education to respond to evolving methods
7 for delivering education and for funding and maintaining capital
8 infrastructures; and

9 “(ii) Establish a more efficient and integrated capital infrastructure sys-
10 tem for preschool through grade 12.

11 “(B) The types and amounts of technical assistance that may be required
12 by public schools for school capital construction programs.

13 “(b) When recommending the capital infrastructure system described in
14 paragraph (a)(A)(ii) of this subsection and the technical assistance described
15 in paragraph (a)(B) of this subsection, the task force shall recommend the
16 appropriate role of the Department of Education in supporting the capital
17 infrastructure system and providing the technical assistance.”.

18 On page 2, line 13, after “with” delete the rest of the line and line 14 and
19 insert “a public or private entity.”.

20 In line 34, after the period delete the rest of the line and lines 35 through
21 41 and insert “The department may require school districts and education
22 service districts to provide the following information to the department for

1 inclusion in the database:

2 “(A) The name of the facility;

3 “(B) The square footage of the facility;

4 “(C) The year the facility was built;

5 “(D) The major renovations made to the facility in the preceding 30 years;

6 “(E) The outstanding bonded indebtedness of the school district or edu-
7 cation service district;

8 “(F) The year, amount and purpose of the last bond request approved by
9 voters of the school district or education service district;

10 “(G) Operations and maintenance costs of the facility;

11 “(H) Technical upgrades needed for the facility;

12 “(I) Health and safety upgrades needed for the facility;

13 “(J) Energy usage of the facility; and

14 “(K) Other publicly available information about the facility.”.

15 On page 3, after line 1, insert:

16 “(3) If a school district or education service district is unable to provide
17 any of the information required under subsection (2) of this section from
18 existing data or without acquiring additional resources, the school district
19 or education service district may request a waiver of the requirement for
20 that information from the Superintendent of Public Instruction.”.

21 In line 2, delete “(3)” and insert “(4)” and delete “nonprofit corporation”
22 and insert “public or private entity”.

23 In line 6, delete “\$350,000” and insert “\$325,000”.

24 In line 11, delete “\$250,000” and insert “\$225,000”.

25 Delete lines 13 through 34.

26 In line 35, delete “9” and insert “6”.

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
